#### For God So Loved the World . . .

In last weekend's Gospel, Jesus explains to the Pharisee Nicodemus that God so loved the world that He gave His only Son that the world might be saved through Him. A timely assurance to bear in mind in the wake of the Charlie Kirk assassination, following so hard on the heels of the shooting at the opening Mass of Annunciation Parochial School in Minneapolis.

I'm obviously deeply saddened by the tragic and senseless deaths of people exterminated at the hands of assassins. But I do recognize that violence is a terrible fact of the broken world we live in, and no one is immune from the potential of such attacks. The very reason why *Thou shalt not kill* had to be included in the Ten Commandments is because of how quick we humans are to snuff out each other's lives. I denounce such violence, of course, but I'm not surprised by it. Jesus even expressly warned that following Him would bring persecution.

I also can understand mental disturbance and psychological disorders, born of the confusion, aimlessness, angst, and fury of a nihilistic view of one's self and the world, that lead people to commit such horrendous acts. There always will be the emotionally and psychologically disturbed among us. Too often these go unattended to until they've gone a bridge too far, as with Tyler Robinson, Robert Westman, and other such shooters.

But truth be told, those aren't the things that shake me to my core in all of this. The phenomenon that made me stop in my tracks this time around is the voices of approval for Tyler Robinson's act that sounded from ordinary people. That citizens from average walks-of-life, ostensibly not on the lunatic fringe but comfortably in the mainstream of the social order, would applaud the assassination of someone—and even deride those who mourn his death—is an unnerving level of moral depravity. What made me decide to sit down and write this column is when I learned that a secret service agent posted a comment on Facebook to the effect that Charlie Kirk's death didn't deserve mourning because he "spewed hate" on his show, and then went on to insinuate that his slaying was karma. Now I'll admit, I've never actually heard Mr. Kirk's show; but I can't imagine anything more appropriately being called hate than saying that this person's murder is not fit to be grieved.

It was troubling enough to hear Mayor Jacob Frey's callous dismissal of prayer for the victims of the Annunciation School shooting, as if prayer were a meaningless waste of time. Prayer obviously was of great importance to these people: the parents of one of our parishioners were among those who had been wounded; her mother, a few days after the attack, asked a friend to bring her the Eucharist in the hospital. Her prayer-life obviously was a source of strength for her.

But the assent given to Mr. Kirk's murder reveals a deeper and all-the-more crucial moral crisis. We're not now talking just about the horrible tragedies that can befall us in life; we're not talking simply about the psychologically deranged mind. What we're seeing is the malady of deformed consciences—a malady that's become all too common in our post-modern age. The contrast between this and the response of those who mourn for

Mr. Kirk is striking. That the response was to gather for prayer and candle-lit vigils seems to me to speak for itself.

Which brings me to today's second reading: the apostle Paul counsels his young protégé Timothy to aim at leading "a quiet and tranquil life in all devotion and dignity." He describes a refreshingly different sort of life from the vitriol, the visceral passion, the rage and contempt that is becoming so characteristic of our world. It's the difference between a worldview that affirms that God is real and one that ignores the divine.

When we neglect and disdain the Sacred—the transcendent God who summons us to our own transcendent destiny of sanctification—then the notion of the sacredness of life ultimately is bound to be discarded. Deny that the divine and sacred exist, then human life is robbed of its sacredness. Historically, this has always been the fallout of atheism, from the French Revolution to Nazi Germany, to the Communist regimes of Lenin, Stalin, Mao, and Pol Pot. Christianity, on the other hand, is responsible for introducing the concept of the inviolate dignity of every person into civilization. (In fact, the word *person* as we understand it today was first used to express the unique sovereignty of each human being by the Christian philosopher Tertullian.)

But it's not just explicit atheism. Our negligence of church as sacred space and a gathering of people for a sacred purpose—Church as that which is set apart for the transcendent and holy to have its own tangible corners in this profane world—causes everything which is beautiful, true, and good to lose its sacred character in our eyes.

And when this happens, what's left but an empty husk of a world? It loses its glamour because we've stopped seeing the wonder in it. We stop talking with each other about God, we stop looking for God, we stop allowing God to be the bond that holds us together, and we stop considering that God is real and present with us. When we don't allow Him into the public spaces of our world, then our world loses its savor. We come to develop a vision of a God who is disgusted by His creatures—that is, if they admit to His existence at all. This certainly was the attitude of that secret service agent, as well as that of Natalie Rupnow, who opened fire on the students of Abundant Life Christian School in Madison, Wisconsin last December. Miss Rupnow decried all humanity as being "filth," while the agent apparently picks and chooses those people he deems should be regarded as filth.

Our world seems to have lost sight of last week's Gospel: that God so loved the world that He sent His only Son to save us. This is the hope expressed by those who gathered for prayer for Charlie Kirk and his family. God doesn't discard us; He loves us so deeply as to reach out to save us from our own sinfulness: to call us back to Himself to be transformed by self-renunciation and healing.


In the second Eucharistic Prayer of the Mass the Sacrament is called the Bread of Life and the Chalice of Salvation. Together, the Body and Blood of our Lord—the full presence of Christ's very person given for us—is Life and Salvation. Life: the precious gift of our very being given and sustained by the

Trinity; and salvation: the transformation of our worldview to one of hope that keeps that life from becoming weary, stale, flat, and unprofitable (in the words of Hamlet). Without this, life is cheap.

Ultimately, decency, self-restraint, and humility are the basis for living a life of peace: that quiet and tranquil life that Paul recommends, a life of dignity and devotion. When we come to recognize this, we discover that the Commandments are not restrictions on our personal freedom, but the wisdom that opens up before us the more abundant life.

It's no coincidence that Paul links dignity with devotion (or piety, which would be a more exact translation of the original Greek word). In order to develop a true respect for the dignity of others we need to grasp our own dignity: self-respect, knowing myself to bear the image of God and therefore not absolutely the subject only of my own desires but having the duty to discover the sacred, the true, and to shape my life by these. But this only comes from an encounter with the God who so loved the world that He gave His only Son that the world might be saved—and retrieve its dignity—through Him. Before I can see humanity properly, I must see myself properly. And before I see myself properly, I must lift my eyes to the God who created me, who created the whole human race, and who cares deeply and eternally for me. To realize what we affirm in the opening prayer to today's Mass: that all the commands of God's sacred law are founded upon love of Him and of our neighbor.







#### LORD MAMMON

"No one can serve two masters . . . You cannot serve both God and mammon," (Lk 16:12-13) serve as conclusion to a gospel reading that opened with Jesus' parable about how the servants of mammon operate (Lk 16:1-8). Comic humor in the Roman world typically has the stupid authority figure being outfoxed by the son, servant or slave. No admirable figures in the play. "... some call it racketeering, I call it business," says one of the gangsters in the Ken Burns PBS documentary, "Prohibition". Whether it's a stupid rich man whose estate manager pulls one last scam to secure his future on his way out the door or a gangster enriched by societal resistance to prohibition, audiences do not see themselves in the drama.

Before Jesus' audience can be too comfortable with that distance between themselves and rich landowners, their estate managers, and perhaps even those debtors with agricultural contracts for such large amounts of grain and olive oil, Jesus shifts to the level of trustworthiness in the "small stuff", ordinary affairs (vv. 10f). Typical agricultural leases from Roman Egypt stipulate repaying owners ca. 25% more than what had been advanced for planting. Those in the parable are not small farmers in rural Galilee.

Our reading from the mid-8<sup>th</sup> century prophet Amos (8:4-7) condemns a wealthy elite in the northern Jewish kingdom for a "life style of the rich and famous" from unjustly piling up wealth that has increased poverty. Even while observing religious festivals, these people are calculating how to squeeze more profit from wheat sales. Their scams are so familiar that marketplaces in ancient Greece had officials in charge to check for offenders: cheat on the volume, inflate currency, sell inferior product, and manipulate scales. The result, a wealth gap so great that a poor man sells for no more than the price of sandals! That's not the justice that God expects of his people. Jesus held up a mirror to the economics of "Lord Mammon" so that we would not expect any "Kingdom of God" square on that Monopoly board.




Tom Coan, Child Safety Program Coordinator, will be available after each Mass on the weekend of September 13/14 to help you complete your 2026 Child Safety's documents.


