



Jay's Letter to the Congregation

Dear Friends in Christ,

It is with a mixture of sadness and gratitude that I share the news of my resignation as Director of Music Ministry at Good Shepherd Parish. Beginning this November, I will be stepping into a new calling as a full-time hospice chaplain, a vocation that has been unfolding in my life for several years.

As some of you know, in May of last year I completed training as an end-of-life doula (a credential you may have noticed listed next to my name in the bulletin). This was my first step in responding to God's call to serve the dying and their loved ones. My passion for this ministry grew from personal experience: I witnessed the deep need for presence, compassion, and spiritual support for those nearing the end of their life. Over the past 16 months, I have offered music at hospice remembrance services, delivered free presentations on end-of-life care, and served on the Parmenter Foundation's Education & Outreach Committee. These opportunities have prepared me for the privilege of accompanying the sick and dying as a chaplain.

When I began serving as your Director of Music Ministry in February 2022, my priority was to create a ministry where all felt welcomed to share their gifts in service of the liturgy. While I hoped our music would sound beautiful, my deeper concern was always that it would proclaim the Word of God and reinforce the lessons of the Mass. I often joke that the only reason I can recite the Preamble to the Constitution is because of Schoolhouse Rock. While you may have just chuckled reading that, the spiritual truth behind it is this: music has the power to awaken our senses, to root words in our memory, and to open our hearts to meaning in ways that speech alone cannot. Think of how many prayers or scripture passages you know by heart simply because you encountered them in song. As music ministers, our responsibility is to help the congregation experience and participate fully in the liturgy through song, joining voices together in the praise of God.

I am deeply grateful to all who have supported and shared in this mission with me. To the Good Shepherd staff, past and present: Fr. Ren, Fr. Dave, Fr. Austin, Fr. Joe, Fr. George, Deacon Colm, Deacon Geoff, Liliana, Julio, Emilia, Nurse Jean, Kat, Debora, Sue, Vina, Susan, and Kelly; thank you for working tirelessly to minister to the flock God has entrusted to our care. To our cantors: Pete, Christina, Sheila, Cristi, and Abby; I know well the personal sacrifice required of a cantor, and I am so grateful that you share your time and talents with our parish. To our instrumentalists: Pete, Ron, Mary Beth, and Magda;

your contributions have made our liturgies more vibrant in a way that only instruments can. To the choir: I could never have dreamed that I would lead such a passionate and energetic group of singers. Thank you for your patience, dedication, and unmistakable humor. I remind you of my favorite choir "motto" from St. Teresa of Calcutta: "I can do things you cannot, you can do things I cannot; but together, we can do great things for God."

To my fellow parish doulas, Nurse Jean and Susan: thank you for walking these first steps with me on the road to my next calling. To my dear friend and your former music director, Jody Pongratz: thank you for being the one who "gets it" when no one else does. And to you, the parishioners of Good Shepherd: I have been continually moved by the fervor with which you sing. From my very first day, your voices lifted in worship have given glory to our Awesome God and filled my heart with joy.

My final day with the parish will be Sunday, November 2, fittingly marked by the Commemoration of All Souls. Fr. Ren has graciously offered to host a farewell reception following the 4:00 Mass on Saturday, November 1. I hope you will join me as we give thanks together for the many blessings God has poured out on this parish.

Finally, I would like to leave you with a reflection on the Prayer of St. Francis. Many know a paraphrased version of it from Sebastian Temple's beloved hymn, but the most current translation speaks with a depth that has shaped my vocation as a hospice chaplain. The prayer reminds me that in every season of life – even in sorrow, suffering, and loss – God calls us to become way-showers of His peace, His love, and His mercy. May these words touch you as they continue to touch me:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace: where there is hatred, let me sow love; where there is injury, pardon; where there is doubt, faith; where there is despair, hope; where there is darkness, light; where there is sadness, joy.

O divine Master, grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console, to be understood as to understand, to be loved as to love.

For it is in giving that we receive, it is in pardoning that we are pardoned, and it is in dying that we are born to eternal life.

GIVING THANKS

A feature on NPR show and podcast, "Hidden Brain", permits callers to thank their "unsung heroes" – people whose names they never knew and could never thank for interventions, large and small, that made all the difference in their lives. Perhaps some of these heroes will be listening. Since callers typically describe events that happened years ago, their gratitude is not the obligatory "thank-you note". That giving thanks that makes the heart happy enough to last a lifetime. And some also indicate that what an anonymous stranger did for them also changed how they treat others. Even though they could not thank their benefactor, they can "pay it forward"!

Our readings from 2 Kings 5:14-17 and Luke 17:11-19 describe miraculous healing of a scale-like, white skin disease (not leprosy as we know it), that required isolation until it cleared up. Mosaic law (Lev 13) stipulated that priests were to serve as "health officers" as well as the sacrificial offering to God for healing. When Jesus tells the group, "show yourselves to the priests", he refers to dermatological inspections by the priests. Samaritans also followed their version of Mosaic Law. So, that leper is only a "foreigner" because Samaritans do not worship God where Jews headed for the Jerusalem Temple do.

Naaman's healing story in chapter 5 is more complicated. He was top general for Israel's enemies. So, when he came into Israel for healing, he arrived with a letter from the Aramean king to Israel's king, a retinue of horses and chariots and a king-size reward. Surprise. Elisha doesn't even come out. Just sends the message, "wash in the Jordan 7 times". One of Naaman's underlings then had to persuade him to do as the prophet ordered. Next Elisha refuses to accept any compensation for the cure. Naaman finally gets it. Israel's God is the "unsung hero" to be thanked. So, he requests a two-mule load of Israelite earth, promising to worship only God. Except when royal duties require following his king, see v. 18!


