Of Broken Statues and Bent Crosses . . .

If you blinked, you missed it.

Two Tuesdays ago, for one night only, the documentary movie *Broken Mary* played in select theatres. It tells the story of Kevin Matthews, a stand-up comedian/radio personality from Chicago, a minor local celebrity, who found a beat-up, broken statue of the Blessed Mother shortly after being diagnosed with MS. He saw in the statue a symbol for himself: broken, but loved by God—an apt description not just of himself, but of all of us. This encounter with the mystery of God's presence in his suffering wondrously led him to a real religious conversion. It is often in those times when we might be challenged to shake our fist at God and cry out "Why me?" that some folks actually find God's love and allow Him to enfold them to His Sacred Heart.

Human suffering is a great mystery. And as Mr. Matthews discovered, this mystery finds its meaning in the Passion of Jesus Christ. It's a captivating mystery, one that has engaged the contemplation of saints over the ages, from the Carmelite St. John of the Cross to St. Paul of the Cross, founder of the Passionists. This order of priests, founded in 1747, was dedicated to penance and preaching the Gospel. Paul himself went about barefooted and bare-headed (in an age when people traveled by foot or horseback in the sun, so hats were essential protection against the heat of the day and other adverse weather conditions). While drawing up the rules for the congregation, he had confined himself to a narrow cell, and throughout his life he devoted himself to an austere lifestyle. He recognized what so few come to know—and even those only by the light of grace: that the love of God is a sacrificial love that finds its purest expression in the Cross. "Christ crucified is a work of love," he wrote; "The miracle of miracles of love."

In our own day, this great mystery of redemptive suffering was placed before our eyes by Pope St. John Paul II. In 1984, at the beginning of his pontificate, he issued the encyclical letter *Salvifici Doloris* ("Declaring the Power of Salvific Suffering"), in which he meditates on the Passion of Christ as the supreme example of God's love for us—a love that chose to share the suffering of our human condition. Because of this, Christ's passion also transforms our own suffering into a participation in

His redemption of the world.

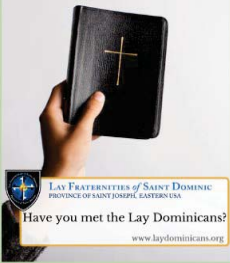
By itself, the encyclical remains fairly unconvincing. But the model that John Paul II would later show in his own life adds great resonance to his words. The picture of him struggling with age and Parkinson's Disease, frail, quavering, and in pain—but still soldiering on, remains vivid in the memory of those who witnessed the last days of his papacy. The countless photos of the pontiff, face grimacing with anguish, yet paradoxically still serene, still populate the internet. Often these pictures show him with his head resting on a crucifix of his own design: based on a crucifix described by St. John of the Cross, the crossbar to which Jesus's hands are nailed is bowed downward, as if our Lord were in the process of snapping it. It's a compelling image, well worth meditating on: in the midst of His suffering Christ is actually breaking the instrument of suffering.

This week we celebrate the feast days of both of these saints of redemptive suffering: St. Paul of the Cross's memorial is Monday, and St. John Paul the Great we commemorate on Wednesday. May they remind us that, while suffering is not something to be sought after for its own sake, it is a reality of our human condition that we can accept as a participation in Christ's own passion. Even suffering itself is not pointless; thanks to the sacrifice of Calvary Hill it can mysteriously be transformed into the work of salvation—our own and that of others. "The world lives unmindful of the sufferings of Jesus," St. Paul of the Cross laments, "which are the miracle of the miracles of the love of God." If the world has forgotten how to suffer with dignity and hope, these two saints remind us that human frailty is not something to be terrified of, but can be endured as a witness to the saving power of the Cross of Christ.

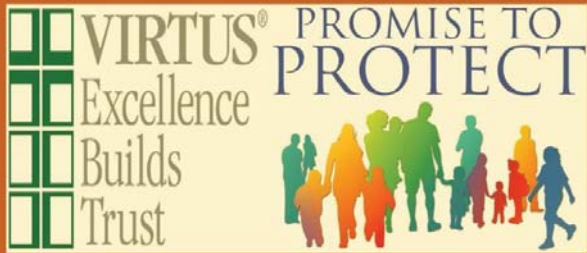

JUSTICE COMPELLED

As long as Aaron and Hur could keep Moses' hands raised, Israelites fighting on the plain below were victorious. By the end of the day, they had driven off much stronger Amalekite attackers (Exod 17:8-13). From the beginning of Israel's story, readers learn that it is God's strength brings victory to the just, not military superiority. (Remember Pharaoh's chariot forces drowned in the Sea in Exod 15). Of course, Moses received instructions directly from God. Later in their history King David will experience the ups and downs of battling enemies. So, does war create justice for the oppressed?

Jesus tells a different story to illustrate the need "to pray always without becoming weary" (Lk 18:1-8). Instead of clues for how to prop up flagging arms or adopt special seating like Moses, we confront one of Jesus' rogue parables. A judge who takes pride in complete disdain for God's law, which requires concern for the poor, the widow (Deut 24:17; Isa 1:17), and for what people think, is compelled to deliver justice. Why? As Jesus tells the story, not because the man had any conversion. His mental process remains self-absorbed. But as the widow presses her case, he feels eventually that he is going to be beaten up in a boxing match. (Our translation, "strike me" refers to giving someone a black eye. Does he at least care about his looks??)

Papyri from Roman Egypt have appeals from widows for justice against relatives who have deprived them and their children of property and other inheritance rights. Judges have to summon the miscreants to appear before righting the wrong ... if, in fact that happened. These women are up against stronger male relatives. It takes determination and courage to even show up once. So, "to pray always" takes more courage than the fighters on the plain. Of course, Jesus has to detach God from any likeness to the judge of his story. Justice for God's chosen is always top priority. But, final question remains: will faith remain on earth?
