To Touch the Flesh of the Least Among Us...

New Englanders are historically provincial. Some time ago I was chatting with a friend of mine, a transplant from L.A., who was remarking on this. I reminded him that New Englanders are the ones who landed and stayed. All the pioneers had ventured westward in the mid-nineteenth century; those who stayed along the eastern seaboard were the settlers, so it's no wonder we tend to hunker down. The fact that winter lasts nine months of the year here doesn't help either. And of course, the situation has only been amplified by the advent of highspeed internet and social media; now we insulate in our own houses and access the world around us via broadband. And don't even get me started on Zoom . . .

But the Catholic Church is a Church that's meant to reach out from herself to others, to conscientiously step outside our comfort zones and touch the Other with the grace of Christ. In *Dilexi te*, the apostolic exhortation that Pope Leo XIV just issued a few weeks ago, the holy father reminds us of Christ's love for the poor—a love that the Church, as Christ's Body on earth, is meant to make real again and again throughout history. His Holiness reminds us that Christ eternally makes a preferential option for the poor, explaining that "this 'preference' never indicates exclusivity or discrimination towards other groups, which would be impossible for God. It is meant to emphasize God's actions, which are moved by compassion toward the poverty and weakness of all humanity" and that God "asks us, his Church, to make a decisive and radical choice in favor of the weakest."

He continues: "As the Body of Christ, the Church experiences the lives of the poor as her very 'flesh,' for theirs is a privileged place within the pilgrim people of God. Consequently, love for the poor—whatever the form their poverty may take—is the evangelical hallmark of a Church faithful to the heart of God." Concrete contact with the poor, in the spirit of solidarity and communion, is communion with God Himself. More than just the efficient response of simply meeting the material needs of the less fortunate, the Church's outreach to the poor is an essential way to incarnate Christ in this world. Referencing his predecessor Pope Francis, Leo stresses that "the Christian tradition of visiting the sick, washing their wounds, and comforting the afflicted is not simply a philanthropic endeavor, but an ecclesial action through which the members of the Church 'touch the suffering flesh of Christ."

In other words, what makes the Church unique is that she goes beyond welfare or charity (as that word is currently used), to communion among all her members or whatever class or condition. The pope reminds us that St. Francis of Assisi "did not found a social service organization, but an evangelical fraternity. In the poor, he saw brothers and

sisters, living images of the Lord. His mission was to be with them, and he did so through a solidarity that overcame distances and a compassionate love. Francis' poverty was relational: it led him to become neighbor, equal to, or indeed lesser than others."

It's serendipitous that our Holy Father should issue this exhortation now. Deacon Colm and I have been speaking with Father Chris Wallace, the pastor of All Saints in Haverhill, working on forming a relationship with that parish. Our youth ministry is scheduled to help with the food pantry at All Saints, which serves meals to the poorest members of the urban community of Haverhill and the surrounding towns. Right now, we have two dates slated: November 22nd (in preparation for Thanksgiving) and March 21st.


My hope is that we can start from this modest beginning and expand our relationship in the future. This will give our parishioners—particularly our teens—the opportunity to reach out to less fortunate communities in the archdiocese, so they can begin to recognize and appreciate that deprivation and want are also a local reality. At the same time, it will also be a living witness to the fact that we are a *universal* church: not merely a free-standing parish, but one organ in the larger Body of Christ.

When we enter into this relationship with humility and gratitude for the blessings God has given us, it transforms us as it transforms the circumstances of those we reach out to serve. In a way far more profound and profitable than mere donations to worthy causes, it can serve as an exchange of goods—both spiritual and material—between our two communities. And it becomes an encounter with Christ Himself, who chose to become poor for our sake and who summons us to follow Him along the path of humility. By encountering them in their true dignity, as human persons and not just as those who are "less fortunate" than us, our own humanity is awakened, and we receive the great gifts that they have to offer us from their spiritual treasure and the wealth of their personhood.

In this way, we find Christ, and we lay hold of our own redemption. As Pope Leo reminds us of the poor, "[t]he attention due to them, rather than a mere social requirement, is a condition for salvation." Please join me in praying that this new adventure of Good Shepherd Parish with All Saints Parish will lead us all to eternal life, to be with Christ who for our sake, though rich, chose to become poor.



GOD'S WAVELENGTH

An extraordinary technical achievement placed the James Webb telescope a million miles from earth with instruments to read infrared wavelengths.

Astronomers have images of the universe 13 billion

Astronomers have images of the universe 13 billion years ago. What's the wavelength for radiation from God? Sirach promised that the prayers of the lowly not only contact God, but "...will not withdraw until the Most High responds, judges justly, and affirms the right" (Sir 35:16-18). On the PBS show, "After Action", featuring interviews with Veterans, a POW from Desert Storm described her experience of answered prayer. Somehow in the pain, fear, confusion of being captured as she prayed for God's help, she felt warmth spread from head to toe.

Eventually freed by marines, trauma from being a POW persists, but so does her experience of God answering the prayers of suffering lowly ones. In 2 Tim 4:6-8, 16-18, Paul recognizes that there will be no rescue from death after a grueling Roman imprisonment. No one appeared on his side in the first hearing despite many friends in the Roman churches (cf. Rom 16). We are used to Paul's confidence that he carries out the mission God gave him. His "the Lord will rescue men from every evil threat..." resembles words of the Lord's Prayer, "...deliver us from evil".

But Paul is not concerned about gaining a victor's crown. He anticipates the great company in heaven of "all who have longed for his [= Jesus'] appearance". Writing from an earlier imprisonment Paul told Philippian believers that without them, his crown is worthless (Phil 2:16-17). Jesus directs a parable toward people "convinced of their own righteousness ... despised everyone else" (Lk 18:9-16). In other words, such people leave out both God and the lowly, sufferers who are God's special concern. Instead of acknowledging that without God's blessing he would not be righteous, the Pharisee lists his bonus points. Our tax-collector, on the other hand, is desperate. Pounding his chest like a mourner, he sends an urgent cry for mercy. That's the prayer that God hears.




