Noblesse Oblige in the Kingdom of God . . .

One of the things that makes being a speaker of English so adventurous is that our understanding of the words we use changes with time. As a former English major it always grates on me when I hear the word “genius” being used as an adjective. According to Hoyle (or Webster’s, as the case may be), “genius” refers to a person who exhibits exceptional intelligence; the word for *an idea* that is extraordinarily brilliant is “ingenious.” . . . But I suppose I’ll have to get used to the fact that the parlance is changing, and “genius” as an adjective is here to stay (at least for a while, till the next change comes).

A particular case in point is the Church’s terms “holy day of obligation” and the “Sunday obligation.” People nowadays recoil at these phrases: they resent the implication that they *have to* come to Mass. Personally, I’m not too crazy about that notion either—not because I bristle at the insinuation that being a Catholic places a responsibility on me, but more because I dislike the inference that worshiping God is some kind of an arduous chore.

I once read a spin on the term “Sunday obligation” given by a particularly inventive pastor who chose to interpret it as a gesture of appreciation. He likened the phrase to the old-time expression we might hear used in Westerns, “much obliged,” which roughly means “Thank you.” This priest invited his readers to understand the “Sunday obligation” as referring to something we do in order to show our gratitude to God for giving us the gift of life, and especially for redeeming us by the Blood of His only begotten Son. This interpretation seems to me to sit better than the understanding that we’re dragging ourselves to church because we have to.

But for an even more accurate understanding of the term we need to retrieve the original meaning of the word *obligation*. The word first appears in English at the turn of the fourteenth century, and means “a binding pledge.” It comes from the Latin word for “pledge”: *obligatio*. I like this sense of the phrase. It reminds us that what we’re talking about is not a constraint or a compulsion, but the nature of a relationship.

When we’re baptized we enter into a relationship with the Blessed Trinity: on God’s part, He gives us a share in the life of Christ, which includes the promise of His saving grace and ultimately eternal joy in Heaven. On our part we agree to remain connected to that relationship, to uphold the behavior that is necessary to sustain and nourish that relationship. Just as a marriage contains the expectation and requirements that the couple remain in relationship with each other through fidelity and intimacy, so too the covenant relationship we enter into with God at

baptism carries with it the expectation of our staying in communion with Him. God pledges to the baptized person to draw him/her into intimate relationship with Him; the person accepting baptism—and the people who present their child to be baptized—respond by making the pledge to maintain and develop that relationship. The Sunday obligation, or better: *obligatio*, is the fulfillment of that pledge. It’s how we grow that relationship: by hearing God’s Word in the Scripture readings, by praising Him in the Eucharistic prayer, by receiving Him in the Blessed Sacrament, and by remaining in community with the fellowship of believers. These are all the things we normally would expect from anyone we share a relationship with—to listen to them, to appreciate them, to unite with them, and to be included in the wider family circle that joins us all together.

When we think about it in these terms, the Sunday obligation (and other holy days of obligation) doesn’t impose an outside constriction on us. It doesn’t fasten a ring in our nose so we can be dragged along. Nor does it hijack our free will or attempt to limit our capacity to choose for ourselves. Rather it honors our freedom by taking our pledge seriously, and by assuming that we take seriously the relationship we’ve chosen to enter into. It’s the *noblesse oblige*: the trait of personal honor and generosity; the willing acceptance of a duty that is “the obligation of nobility” which comes with being an heir in the Kingdom of God.

GROWING SOUL

God did not create souls apart from the human bodies in Genesis. God gave the human living creatures an enhanced form of life with a gift of the Spirit. For the Old Testament following God's justice in Torah and believing in God's loving care is never about gaining a place in heaven. By Jesus' day some Jews had concluded that a loving God had planned life beyond this one for humanity. Today's reading from Wisdom affirms that "the souls of the just in the hand of God" (Wisd 3:1-9). That 1st century BCE author adopted the language of "souls" from Greek philosophers. Other Jewish teachers including Pharisees and Jesus imagined God restoring humans as "embodied selves" on the day of judgment.

Whatever is embodied must also grow like all living things. It could be a worrisome task if proceeding toward eternal life required us to produce prize-winning plants or the mega-pumpkin at the Topsfield Fair. Not to panic. St. Paul highlights the rescue mission which Christ mounted for imperfect, failing specimens, "while we were still sinners" (Rom 5:5-11). It enables the "love of God that has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit" to reshape lives. Fortunately, those soul-plants growing back into new life need not become blue ribbon winners. Jesus promises that all those God has entrusted to him will be raised on the last day (Jn 6:37-40).

Of course, any poorly cultivated souls will experience the consequences (cf. the rich man in Lk 16:19-31). A character in R.F. Kuang's new "tour of the underworld" novel suggests that karma is not an accounting problem but results from growing bad seed: "...ripple effect of your original evil ... whole point of Hell is to show the full extent of what you've asked for," (*Katabasis*: 2025, p. 282). Wisdom omits hell. Instead, the wicked oppressors feel the pain of what they lost by seeing the righteous experiencing the glory of eternal life. Then the wicked vanish, "dispersed like smoke before the wind" (Wisd. 5:14).

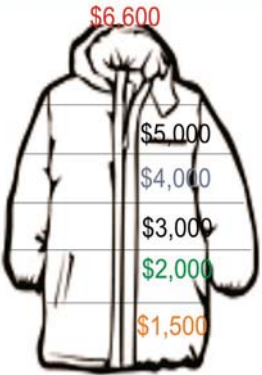

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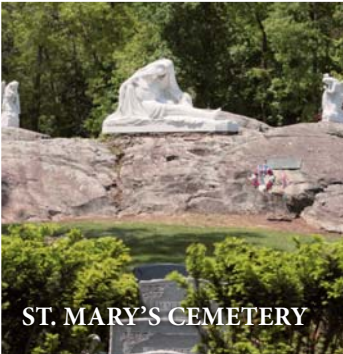

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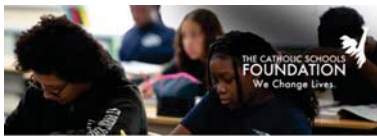
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
