

In God We Trust . . .

I've always been fascinated by Jesus in the Garden. One of my favorite paintings is Carl Bloch's "Christ in Gethsemane"; and the sorrowful mysteries are my favorite to pray when I'm doing the Rosary. What captivates me the most about the episode is that one powerful line: *not my will, but Yours be done.*

If we take the gospel seriously, this total submission to God's will demands a lengthy reflection. What are we to make of this concession? What does it reveal about the Man who concedes to God's will—and not only once, but three times in the course of the night?

We know it was a struggle for Jesus; the way the scene is set and how His disposition is described shows us that much. He is careful to insulate Himself from intrusion: He stations one round of sentries in the form of the nine apostles He'd left outside the garden, and then sets up a second post manned by Peter, James, and John. He wanted privacy and security. He was aware that the armed crowd was on its way from town, and He needed to establish a series of barriers so that He could concentrate fully on His prayer, without having to glance back over His shoulder every few minutes to see how near the mob was advancing. The imminent danger clearly preyed on His mind.

His words to Peter, James, and John set the tone strikingly enough: "I am deeply grieved, even to death." His trauma is profound and heavy. Mark tells us that He threw Himself on the ground at the beginning of His prayer; He didn't just drop to the ground or collapse—He threw Himself. Fatigue, fear, even depression and desperation all at once are captured in one single maneuver. Luke gives us the most memorable image of Jesus here when he says that His sweat became like great drops of blood falling on the ground. There's something terrible going on here, terrible enough to thoroughly unnerve the Man who faced raging demoniacs and expelled the evil spirits with a word of command, the Man who bested Satan himself in three short rounds—and that while He was half-starved! But what's about to happen now, this is something that chills Him to the bone. Unquestionably, this was a momentous struggle for Jesus.

Sprawled out there on the ground, He makes an appeal to His Father to be excused from the Passion. But the curious thing is, He doesn't dwell on that petition. He adds nothing to emphasize the urgency of the request. He doesn't even give the Father a moment to think it over. Immediately, He asserts "yet not my will, but Yours be done." What does all this mean?

It would be all too easy to dismiss it as defeatism. Are we


left with the picture of a Man who shrugs His shoulders, knowing that His fate is a foregone conclusion but who makes one last-ditch attempt to gain a reprieve even though He knows it's pointless? Or is it quietism? A stoic resignation that whatever will be will be, so let's just roll with the punches? But this is entirely incompatible with everything the evangelists did to set the scene for us; so no, that can't be it.

In the final analysis, the only credible answer is that Jesus's deference to the Father's will is nothing less than an act of supreme and perfect trust. The Son doesn't merely set aside His will in preference to the Father's; He allows His will to be enfolded into the Father's, that they might be united as one will. He trusts not only in the wisdom of the Father's will, not only in its goodness; ultimately, His trust is that the Father's will is identical to the Father's love.

Trust is the nourishment of love. When we come to love anyone, we venture to trust that person. The more we trust, the deeper our love becomes. If we truly trust our beloved, we'll have a greater confidence that our beloved's will is for the good: that will has our own best interest in mind. Jesus doesn't merely accept the Father's will as a more powerful force that can overcome His own will; Jesus wants to share in His Father's will because He trusts that the Father only wills what is good.

When God reveals His will to us, what He in fact is doing is offering His love. And that love is accepted when we give room for His will to play itself out. *Your will be done* is the perfect expression of trust and love; and when that will is done, we see just how perfectly God loves us.

HOPE PRESCRIPTION

"For you . . . there will arise the sun of justice with its healing rays," (Mal 3:20a) is God's promise to faithful Jews in 5th century BCE Judah, a tiny province in the Persian empire. People were losing hope in establishing the rule of justice depicted in God's Torah. In Jesus' day a Jewish sect, the Essenes, hoped that creating a group which isolated members from all evil would hasten the Messiah, prayed before dawn every day, "... when the sun rises... they shall offer praise and respond saying, 'Blessed be the God of Israel' ..." (4Q503). Scholars think that contemplating the orderly heavens kept the righteous from feeling swamped by the world of injustice.

Waiting in pre-dawn chill for the sun to emerge over the ridge, I imagined that elsewhere it was already dawn. Not exactly the Scout handbook, but at age 10 it moved time. Today's gospel (Lk 21:5-19) presents a longer time frame with all those familiar mega-evils in politics ("nation against nation") and nature ("earthquakes, famine, plague"). In addition to living in chaotic times, Christians can expect persecution. But the danger, Jesus anticipates is one created by false messiah figures. Some even using his name. Such leaders do not advance a healing which comes from the "sun of justice".

Two forms of "hope sickness" are familiar enough: (i) cynical "sometimes justice, but overall bad guys win"; (ii) enthusiasm for messiah-like leaders. Unlike Jesus these pseudo-Christs take the path of suffering. St. Paul seems to have yet another "diseased hope" case in 2 Thess 3:7-12. Exactly what those Christians chastised for living in a "disorderly way" were doing is unclear, though others provided charity. An idler's "ditch work" policy might come from misreading Paul's teaching that the risen Christ was about to return in judgment (1 Thess 4:13-18). A type (iii), believing that magic transformation is at hand is also false. Pope Francis wrote, "the reasons for our hope – these are dependent on the Lord, not convenience or trends," (*Hope*, p. 233).




