Mother of the Faithful People of God, Pray For Us . . .

Here's a joke for ya.

A little old Italian lady goes into St. Leonard's in the North End, kneels in front of the statue of the Virgin Mary, lights a votive candle and begins praying fervently. "Ohh, Madonna, mah son, he a-going down a badda road. He drinka too much, he play th' cards too much, he no go t' church . . . please, please helppa him." All of a sudden, a voice comes into her ears—a soothing, baritone male voice. "Be not afraid, Rosalie: Nino is in My Hands." The startled woman asks, "Who's a d'is?" The voice responds, "I am Jesus." She shoots back "You mind-a you own bi'ness, I'ma talka to you mott'a."

. . . A couple of months ago, Pope Leo XIV caused a bit of a stir when he approved a document from the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith. It raised questions about certain problematic titles often applied to the Blessed Mother, specifically Mary as "co-redemptrix" and "mediatrix."

The concern that the Holy See had regarding these titles stems from the potential confusion they can provoke. The one mediator between God and humanity is Jesus Christ; and Christ Himself is the sole redeemer of mankind. The notion that Our Lady somehow *actively* played a part in our salvation, as opposed to participating in Christ's mission by cooperation with God's grace, can muddle not only our understanding of the Savior's role in reconciling us to God, but also our appreciation for what Mary's true part in salvation history is. As one of my fellow seminarians once cracked when we were at lunch: Some people talk as though Mary were the fourth person of the Trinity.

The Dicastery wanted to clarify Mary's role, emphasizing particularly her function in God's plan specifically in a maternal way, and through the virtues that every Christian needs to master—namely, those of humility and quiet, prayerful reflection. There's real power in the hidden life of meekness. It's the mystery of a dynamic placidness, which is a third way-of-life qualitatively different from dull passivity on the one hand and assertive activeness on the other. It's waiting for God to lead and then following as a disciple, and Mary is a prime exemplar of just how effective that dynamic placidness is.

This week before us presents us with three separate opportunities to meditate on the Blessed Mother's quiet, steadfast fidelity to God's will. Wednesday is the memorial of Our Lady of Loreto, commemorating the fabled relocation of the Holy Family's house from Nazareth to Loreto Italy. According to legend, so many pilgrims were waylaid by bandits while flocking to the house while it was in its original location that angels picked it up and moved it to the foot of the mountain in Loreto. Eventually (so the story goes) Loreto became equally a magnet site for pilgrims, and consequently an equal target for the highwaymen, so angels once more spirited the house to the top of the mountain,

where it remains to this day. (Ergo, why Our Lady of Loreto is the patron of air travel—a handy thing to keep in mind in this month of holiday travel and college students returning for the between-semester break.) But perhaps the more useful reflection that this fest could call to mind is the reality of Jesus's hidden life, lived out in His childhood house: how Mary brought Him up, nurtured Him, and helped Him mature, as He also impacted her life and spirituality while she treasured all these things in her heart.

Friday is the Memorial of Our Lady of Guadalupe, commemorating the first miraculous appearance of the Virgin Mary to the peoples of the Americas (incidentally, this one *is* legitimate!). Devotion to the Virgin of Guadalupe, including the erection of a shrine, helped convert millions of Aztec Mexicans from a religion of human sacrifice to the Christian Faith. The feast reminds us vividly of what the Vatican's document mentions somewhat casually: that Mary's motherhood is extended to Christ's disciples and even to all human beings.

And Monday's Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception celebrates the unique fact that Mary was preserved from any taint of sin, including original sin, from the very first moment of her life at conception. Once again, it's an occasion to recall that Mary does not redeem us, but rather, as the document explains "the dogma of the Immaculate Conception highlights the primacy and unicity of Christ in the work of Redemption, for it teaches that Mary—the first to be redeemed—was herself redeemed by Christ and transformed by the Spirit, prior to any possible action of her own. From this special condition of being the first redeemed by Christ and the first transformed by the Holy Spirit, Mary is able to cooperate more intensely and profoundly with Christ and the Spirit, becoming the prototype, model and exemplar of what God wants to accomplish in every person who is redeemed."

The Virgin Mary shows us what we are all called to be by virtue of our baptism and our faith. She who was full of grace from the very beginning demonstrated in her entire life what we, who have been filled with grace through the sacraments, need to strive to emulate. And through a habit of reflective prayer, contemplation of God's love and His design, we discover the ways that we're charged to evangelize the world. As the Blessed Mother appeared to Juan Diego at Guadalupe, sparking the conversion of the local Aztecs, we also need to reach out to those not yet touched by God's grace and through our humble fidelity—our dynamic placidness—draw them into the joy of a life in Christ.





JUSTICE AND PEACE

In the 8th century BCE, Isaiah's world was just as torn apart by wars and social injustice as today's Middle East. So, his famous "peaceable kingdom" poem (Isa 11:1-9) was a vision of hope beyond the chaos being caused by rulers seeking a peace through military power. Instead, this king from David's line will inaugurate peace through justice. Our picture of justice focuses on what laws and courts allow. Not so in antiquity. Then the king or judge had to decide what was the just outcome for each case. Isaiah opens with three paired characteristics of the ideal king: (i) wisdom & understanding – ability to decide practical matters; (ii) counsel & strength – dealing with military affairs; and (iii) knowledge & fear of the Lord – devotion to God.

His judgments in practical matters reflect God's concern for the poor, those least able to protect themselves. Where required, the wicked and ruthless will be met with force. Unlike other kings who were portrayed in full military gear, this king has Justice as a waistband and Faithfulness as a belt around his hips. Then Isaiah's vision shifts from a future king to the transformation of creation itself. Some bioengineering is required in the wild animal kingdom to eliminate carnivores and snake venom!

Does that vision of "earth filled with knowledge of the Lord" make Isaiah's depiction of peace through justice irrelevant in the 21st century? Hardly. God's way toward justice and peace represents ruling power that transforms life for all creation. St. Paul's way encouraged believers in Rome to "think in harmony with one another", "welcome one another as Christ welcomed you" (Rom 15:4-6) also highlights a principle for just judgment. A judgment with "wisdom and understanding" is not handing victory to one contestant. Its purpose: restoring the well-being of the community deformed by violence. And to "think in harmony" advice anticipates that both parties emerge from the courtroom accepting the outcome as "best conclusion". Reconciliation and restoration reflect God's justice as the route to peace.

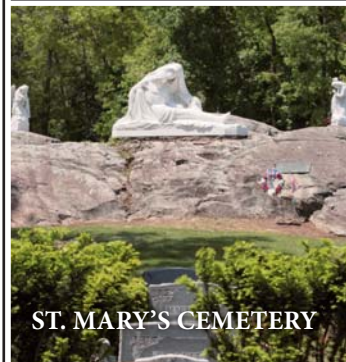
