The Evangelical Counsels and the Beatitudes (Part II-b) . . .

This past September the Institute for Family Studies released a report disclosing their findings that adults are having less sex than ever, and the sharpest decline is among Generation Z. Prudish purity police might be inclined to applaud this as a victory for chastity, but that would be an erroneous understanding of the virtue of chastity. Even if we set aside for the moment the distinct likelihood that contributing to this decline is the ease-of-access to internet pornography and the rise in pornographic addiction, the factors leading to this crisis are not consistent with true purity of heart. The IFS notes that the lack of socialization is at the root of the phenomenon: people are turning to their iPhones for their socialization, not to in-person, real live relationships. As they withdraw into themselves and into their devices, their relational lives become flattened more and more.

But this is to get celibacy entirely wrong. Evangelical chastity isn't a disdain for sex; it's simply a different avenue of participating in the relational value that gives sex its truest significance. Pope St. John Paul II called this relational value the "nuptial meaning of the body"—specifically, the body's conjugal dimension. Those given the grace of evangelical chastity live out that nuptial meaning through spiritual relationality. It's not the deletion of something from one's life; it's turning away from one thing to turn towards something else. The old Baltimore Catechism used to have a picture of a bride and a groom kneeling before the altar at their wedding, with the caption "This is good . . ."; on the opposite page was a picture of a priest receiving ordination, with the caption "... This is better." The Church has since clarified that ordination isn't "better" than holy matrimony (although maybe that's why we're experiencing such a shortage of priests!). What we now recognize is that family-life and evangelical chastity are two sides of the same coin, so to speak.

In the Gospel, Jesus identifies that there are some who make themselves "eunuchs" for the sake of the Kingdom of Heaven. (It might be important to note that Aramaic, the language that Jesus spoke, has no word for a perpetual virgin by choice, so He used the closest word available in that vocabulary—eunuch—for want of a better term.) By practicing perfect continence, the celibate disciplines him- or herself to make a total gift of self to the Church—to God and to His people.

The renowned psychologist Carl Jung called this discipline sexual sublimation. Altogether different from sexual repression, which attempts to stifle and deny one's sex drive (an effort that will only result in a whole host of psychic problems), sublimation is the decision to exercise one's will power to re-channel the sexual energy toward a higher good. In cinema lore, we see this in the original Star Wars trilogy: as Luke develops into a full-fledge Jedi knight, he renounces romance for his higher calling. (The filmmakers, in order to pacify potential objections from fans, justified this by making Leia his twin sister; but the thematic significance was decidedly Jungian.) The priest and consecrated virgin embodies this in real life.

In practical terms, evangelical chastity frees the person from the responsibilities of family life so as to be more available to

the people (s)he is called to serve in God's name. But on a deeper level, it frees his/her affections to be totally oriented toward the other person. If the consecrated person is committed to the vocation of celibacy, (s)he is safeguarded from the disastrous possibility of allowing his/her relationships to morph into something contrary to what they are supposed to be. If my role is to be a spiritual counsellor, but it's permissible for me to be open to the potential of developing a romantic relationship with someone, it becomes all too easy to be drawn into the fragility of the person. Someone seeking my help as a spiritual aide may be confused, lonely, and vulnerable. It would be tempting to allow that to drift into altering the relationship into something it should never become. However honest my intentions may be, I betray my fundamental purpose, I betray the trust the person placed in me (even assuming it can credibly be said that I haven't exploited that trust), and I betray what God has asked of me.

Beyond this, evangelical chastity opens the celibate to a deeper relationship with God, and a total reliance on Him. When Jesus speaks of this in the same Gospel passage I cited above, He says that not everyone can accept the role, but only those to whom it has been given. In fact, when a priest makes his three promises at his ordination, he replies to the bishop's first two questions—regarding obedience and a routine of prayer—by saying "I do." But to the last question, asking for the promise of celibacy, the ordinand answers "I do, with the grace of God." He recognizes that his celibacy is not only a matter of his free choice but can only be achieved by his will cooperating with divine grace.

The central relationship in the consecrated virgin's life is his/her relationship with God, nurtured through intimate prayer. When Jesus explains that in the Resurrection no one will marry because they will be like the angels in Heaven, He's pointing to the fact that the saints in Heaven are fully absorbed in the Beatific Vision, in their perfect worship of God. Those who choose celibacy here and now for the sake of God's Kingdom serve as living witnesses to this truth. They are a startling part of that contrast culture that the Church is meant to be for the world, living entire lives that demonstrate that through Christ the Kingdom of Heaven is among us here in this life.

The Second Vatican Council explains that the Church is the sacrament, or living sign, of Christ in the world. The Church is the Lord's presence in our world today, albeit veiled in mystery. And this mystery, according to the Council, is a sign and instrument of a very closely knit union with God and of the unity of the human race. The evangelical counsel of chastity animates consecrated celibates to make that mystery a bit clearer by dedicating their whole lives to this very closely knit union with God through humble dependence on His abiding presence, expressed in prayer; and to the unity of humanity by their radical availability to others in Spirit-filled service.


A Men's Group to Grow Friendship and Faith, All in Christ

Saint Blaise

Saint Blaise is a bishop and martyr who lived in the fourth century in Turkey and Armenia. For a time, Blaise lived in a cave to escape persecution. On his feast the church recalls a miraculous cure associated with him and celebrates the blessing of the throats. Blaise apparently saved the life of a boy who was choking on a fish bone. The saint said that anyone who lit a candle in his memory would be free of infection, thus candles are used in the traditional throat blessing. He is listed among the Fourteen Holy Helpers, saints revered as healers.

He is the patron saint of throat illnesses, animals, wool combers, and wool trading.

GOD'S FRAMEWORK

When peace negotiators end by announcing that the parties have reached a “framework” with details to be worked out, my perspective on the Middle East schooled by some 4,000 years of history concludes, “failed again.” The politics of power never produces the peace of God’s justice. Our first reading (Zeph 2:3; 3:12-13) spells out the possibility for all the “humble people of the earth” to be kept safe “on the day of the Lord’s wrath”. The requirements are quite specific: observing God’s justice, “do no wrong” and quite specifically speak as those whose hearts have been formed by God’s Torah.

That single-heartedness distinguishes the “humble remnant of Israel” who will experience God’s salvation. Zeph 3:13 puts it, they “*do no wrong, speak no lies, nor shall there be found in their mouths a deceitful tongue.*” Zephaniah may have anticipated that this transformation in God’s people would result from King Josiah’s religious and political reforms. Discovering a scroll of Deuteronomy in the Temple showed how far from God’s Law the nation strayed. As Assyria’s control over the region weakened during Josiah’s reign (640-609 BCE), it seemed possible to expand Judah’s territory. While Deuteronomy as God’s Law provides the key to justice and peace, the “lowly ones of the earth” are not to rule another empire.

Many who heard Jesus announcing that God’s reign was at hand dreamt that he would grab David’s throne. Jesus’ vision of the lowly, humble who will enter God’s kingdom (Matt 5:1-12a) concludes shockingly: “...blessed are those persecuted for the sake of righteousness (= justice) ... persecute you, and utter every kind of evil against you falsely because of me ... reward great in heaven.” Those “little ones” (= “poor in spirit”, “meek”) suffering from the injustice of human rulers receive comfort. Others actively embody that justice, loving God and neighbor, in Deuteronomy: merciful, “clean of heart” (= not divided), peacemakers starved for justice, persecuted. Jesus will embody these virtues, dying on the cross as “king of the Jews”.





The Presentation of the Lord



"We too are called to welcome Jesus who comes to meet us. To encounter him: the God of life is to be encountered every day of our lives; not now and then, but every day. To follow Jesus is not a decision taken once and for all, it is a daily choice." —Pope Francis, Feast of the Presentation of the Lord, 2019

The Presentation of Jesus in the temple shows him to be the firstborn Son who belongs to the Lord. With Simeon and Anna, all Israel awaits its encounter with the Savior—the name given to this event in the Byzantine tradition. Jesus is recognized as the long-expected Messiah, the "light of the nations" and the "glory of Israel," but also "a sign that is spoken against." The sword of sorrow predicted for Mary announces Christ's perfect and unique oblation on the cross that will impart the salvation of God has "prepared in the presence of all peoples" (CCC, no. 529).
