The Honored Ambassador Before God (Part XIV) . . .

The most violent part of a rocket launch is its initial ascent to, and escape from, the atmosphere. It takes a massive amount of fuel, while the stress and heat can wreak havoc on the exterior body of the vessel. This is why, if you've ever watched a launch (and what little boy has never sat fascinated by the sight?), you'll see various parts of the rocket separate as it breaks through. The spent fuel tanks, having already fulfilled their function of providing fuel for the initial take-off, are shed, as is the fairing: the outermost protective shell of the rocket. This fairing is designed precisely to protect the payload from damage during this turbulent launch; once the atmosphere is pierced, this fairing is no longer necessary, so is sloughed off. What remains is a comparatively compact unit, much smaller than the enormous missile that rumbles, quakes, and scorches the earth that it's leaving behind. This essential remainder then wafts buoyantly in the tranquil darkness of outer space—a suspension entirely different from the eruptive take-off.

As the heart and mind ascend closer to God, they too shed the external material that's so indispensable for the "lower" (for lack of a better word) tiers of prayer. The pre-occupation with immediate concerns that shape prayer of petition and intercession; the reflection on earthly blessings that prompts prayers of thanksgiving; even the concentration on Sacred Scripture or religious art that is subject of Christian meditation . . . all of this gets left behind at this point. This is contemplative prayer.

St. Theresa of Avila, the great sixteenth-century Carmelite mystic, describes contemplative prayer as "nothing else than a close sharing between friends; it means taking time frequently to be alone with Him who we know loves us." Catapulted by meditation on texts or images, contemplation lets these mental aids fade into the background as the soul simply rests in a quiet and indescribable sense of God's holy presence.

The history of the Church is blessed with the example and witness of quite a few sublime mystics: Theresa, St. John of the Cross, St. Julian of Norwich, St. Faustina Kowalska, Padre Pio, and St. Thomas Aquinas (yes: in addition to being a brilliant theologian, Thomas also had amazing mystical experiences that often caused him to levitate—no mean feat for the "dumb ox," as the corpulent saint was nicknamed!). These heroes of the faith, specially touched by God's grace for this charism (that is, gift) have left us beautiful and potent records of their mystical marriage with the Lord.

Apart from these mystics, though, contemplative prayer is a rare treat of devotion: such invisible glances at God's love are infrequent and most often fleeting. Occasionally, while I'm seriously at prayer, I'll have a small taste of contemplation: a sudden awareness that I have "broken

through the atmosphere," so to speak, of mental cogitation and have been brushed by the mysterious sense of God's presence. They're far more infrequent than I would like (I get caught up in my own head way too much!), they rarely last very long (maybe a few moments), and they never come when I'm most convinced that I need them. But when they do come, I know I've received a tremendous gift from my Lord.

I'm content to have these few precious gems of contemplation, largely because I know that even the apostle Paul got dragged away from contemplation. After relating to the Corinthian Christians a story about a man (most scholars agree he was talking about himself) who was caught up to Paradise where he heard inexpressible things, he immediately talks about being dragged back down to mundane life by a "thorn in the flesh."

So if contemplation doesn't come, or if doesn't stick around long after it has dropped by, don't get discouraged. Even the great apostle himself got waylaid by the distractions of life in the here-and-now. But the more one cultivates a disciplined habit of prayer, setting aside time daily to dwell with the Lord, the more we till the soil of our soul to prepare it to receive the seed of contemplation.

A wonderful, practical way to open yourself up for contemplative prayer is Eucharistic Adoration. Making a holy hour, sitting silently before Christ in the Blessed Sacrament exposed on the altar, allows us to gaze on His Eucharistic presence and begin to sense a mysterious encounter with Him. St. John Vianney was fond of telling the story of a poor and simple farmer in his parish who came into church every morning to just sit in front of the tabernacle. When curiosity finally got the better of Vianney, he approached the man and asked what he does in that time. "I look at the good God," came the simple answer, "and He looks at me." Neither Theresa of Avila nor John of the Cross, in all their eloquence, could describe contemplative prayer better.

Sometimes the honored ambassador before God doesn't have any message at all to deliver. He just draws near to the Throne and stays there.

GOD AUDIT?

"It would have been me except that Tuesday meeting in NYC was cancelled" or "I decided to go in late because..." typical comments from family or friends not in the Twin Towers 25 years ago. Remembering those events last week also included the heroic and tedious efforts to find fragments of those who died. "What do I do with this? Get mad, stomp on it?" one worker reported her response to identifying a hijacker's pieces. Or more to the point, what would the generous, merciful God of our first reading do? "Let the scoundrel forsake his way ... let him turn to the Lord for mercy; to our God who is generous and forgiving," (Isa 55:6-7).

Most of us will never be faced with such a dramatic challenge: mercy or righteous fury? Jesus draws on routine life in Galilee to illustrate the difference between God's mercy as just and human accounting (Matt 20:1-16a). His audience knew prophets who depicted God as owner of the vineyard, Israel, that did not yield good fruit (Isa 5:1-7). Jesus' parables have a comic touch. Central figures like this vineyard owner have flaws. Given the repeated trips to hire workers, he either radically misjudged what it would take to harvest those grapes, or that the harvest season was very bad. Ordinarily for harvest season, anyone who could work would be hired early.

The owner paid the standard day's wage and met the Law's requirement to pay laborers at day's end (Lev 19:13). But then he blows up the "what's just pay" by giving each worker the same pay. Even a six-year-old would protest that such an outcome is NOT FAIR! Why does the owner insist that such a response permits envy (literally, "your evil eye") to triumph over generosity (lit. "good"). On a human scale, in a bad harvest time the whole community will suffer if many receive no pay. God's generous accounting system calculates the "common good" for all of His beloved creatures.

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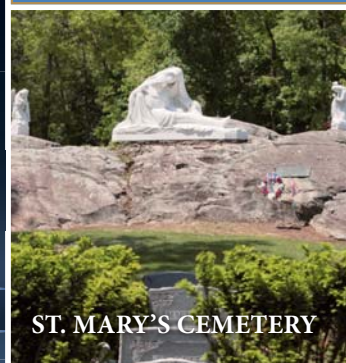
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
