To receive the bread dipped in the wine (intinction), please kneel or stand by the **right-side** of the altar rail.

If you do not wish to receive Holy Communion, you may come to either side of the rail for a blessing. Please cross your arms across your chest to indicate that you wish to receive a blessing—**or** you may remain in your pew for prayer/meditation.


