















Enfant (11 years), 'Future Day' Takeda, Zurich: A Never-Ending Game

"Art4Impact is a tremendous opportunity for our students."

Our 9th graders are deeply motivated by the Art4Impact program, which helps children battling illness. It's more than just an art project they create for themselves and bring home for their own enjoyment and their family's—it gives them a sense of responsibility, purpose, and meaning they don't often experience at their age. It encourages them to rise, to think beyond themselves, to develop empathy, and to create something that inspires and improves hospital life. It's also motivating to see that they don't need to be great at realistic drawing—their creative and impactful ideas are what matter most.

The chance that their design might be painted by professional artists, in XXL format on a hospital wall, is hugely inspiring. It helps them focus and take the project seriously. They often ask me when the jury will meet and when they'll know if a winner was selected from LGB. Last year, during the Y9 end-of-year assembly, when the name of the winner was announced and it turned out to be someone from LGB, the students were so excited—they cheered like crazy..."
