**GOSPEL** Matthew 5:17-37  
A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew.  
(for shorter form read between > <)

> At that time: Jesus said to his disciples, < 'Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfil them. For truly, I say to you, until heaven and earth pass away, not an iota, not a dot, will pass from the Law until all is accomplished. Therefore whoever relaxes one of the least of these commandments and teaches others to do the same will be called least in the kingdom of heaven, but whoever does them and teaches them will be called great in the kingdom of heaven. For > I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.

'You have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not murder; and whoever murders will be liable to judgement." But I say to you that everyone who is angry with his brother will be liable to judgement; < whoever insults his brother will be liable to the council; and whoever says, "You fool!" will be liable to the hell of fire. So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift. Come to terms quickly with your accuser while you are going with him to court, lest your accuser hand you over to the judge, and the judge to the guard, and you be put in prison. Truly, I say to you, you will never get out until you have paid the last penny.'

> 'You have heard that it was said, "You shall not commit adultery." But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart. < If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body be thrown into hell. And if your right hand causes you to sin, cut it off and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body go into hell.'

'It was also said, "Whoever divorces his wife, let him give her a certificate of divorce." But I say to you that everyone who divorces his wife, except on the ground of sexual immorality, makes her commit adultery, and whoever marries a divorced woman commits adultery. > 'Again you have heard that it was said to those of old, "You shall not swear falsely, but shall perform to the Lord what you have sworn." But I say to you: Do not take an oath at all, < either by heaven, for it is the throne of God, or by the earth, for it is his footstool, or by Jerusalem, for it is the city of the great King. And do not take an oath by your head, for you cannot make one hair white or black. > Let what you say be simply "Yes" or "No"; anything more than this comes from evil.'

Year A • 15 February 2026 • Psalter Week 2

## THE WORD

### THE FULFILMENT OF THE LAW

MATTHEW 5:17-37 (SHORTER FORM MT 5:20-22, 27-28, 33-34, 37)



Jesus begins by making a clear and powerful statement: He has not come to abolish the Law or the Prophets but to fulfil them. This means He respects God's commandments and intends to complete and deepen their true meaning.

He then addresses several key commandments – such as "You shall not murder," "You shall not commit adultery," and "You shall not swear falsely." But Jesus challenges us to look beyond simply following rules. He shows that true obedience involves the heart. It's not only about avoiding murder but also about not holding anger or insulting others. It's not just about faithfulness in marriage but also about guarding our thoughts from lust.

Jesus invites us to live by a higher standard – one that transforms our hearts and relationships. It's a call to move from external actions to inner change, seeking love, honesty, and peace.

This teaching asks us to examine our own feelings, words, and attitudes, allowing God to shape us from within, so our lives reflect His love in every part. ■

## SAY

**Prayer of St Augustine:**  
"Lord, make me pure in heart, that  
I may see you clearly.  
Cleanse my thoughts and words,  
help me to live in truth and love.  
Give me the strength to forgive  
and the courage to speak honestly.  
Transform my heart so I may  
follow you fully."

## DO

Take time today to forgive someone who has upset you – even if it's just in your heart. Let go of anger and choose peace, following Jesus' call to reconciliation and love.

## LEARN

True obedience to God isn't just about following rules – it's about letting God change our hearts, so we live with love, honesty, and peace in every part of our lives.



## REFLECT

Jesus teaches us that following God isn't just about obeying rules on the outside – it's about what's happening inside our hearts. He says He came not to cancel the Law but to fulfil it, to bring its deeper meaning to light.

Think about anger, for example. It's easy to say, "I haven't hurt anyone," but Jesus asks us to look closer. Are we holding anger or bitterness inside? Are we quick to insult or judge? True peace begins when we let go of these feelings and seek forgiveness.

Jesus also talks about faithfulness, not just in actions but in our thoughts. It's a reminder that what we allow in our minds shapes who we are. He challenges us to live honestly, speaking truthfully and keeping our promises.

His words call us to a higher way – one that doesn't just avoid harm but actively builds love and peace. It's about changing from the inside out, so our lives show God's kindness in everything we do.

Today, ask yourself: What is God inviting me to change in my heart? Where can I grow in love and truth? Jesus offers His help – His grace is always ready to transform us. ■

All welcome to attend. There will be no noon mass here at St Roberts.

**Apologia** - Fourth Session - an Exploration of the Church's Understanding of Suffering - **Sunday 15th March, 5pm** in the parish centre. The initiative "Apologia" will return in Lent with an exploration of the Catholic Church's understanding of suffering. The sessions got off to a good start in September with a walk through the elements of the Mass. This was followed by the second session on 'The Last Things' examining the Church's teaching on heaven and hell, death and judgement. The next session, entitled 'Faith and Reason' helped us examine the relationship between faith and science, with particular reference to Pope St John Paul II's teaching in his 1998 encyclical 'Fides et Ratio'.
