Second Ordinary Sunday January 14, 2024 "Responding to the Voice of God"

The advertising business spends almost \$700 billion every year on advertising. This is more than \$75.00 for every man, woman, and child on our planet! The advertisers want to sell us goods and services. Some of these things are what we truly need – But most are things that appeal to our wants, our egos – and, too often, to our baser instincts! Consequently, we find ads everywhere we look. They are on TV – in the newspapers – and in every magazine we pick up. And so, it is a daily challenge to resist them – and to discern what will truly benefit us.

If we are a well-integrated person, we learn to tune them out – to ignore most of what assails us. However, what most people don't realize is that satan, himself, works in much the same way. Satan is constantly competing with God for our spiritual attention. In fact, he uses all the ruses of the culture to attract us. He does this to keep us from hearing the Voice of God in our inner self. For when we are focused on the voices of the culture, it can be very hard to hear and listen to the Voice of God!

In the first scripture passage, Samuel was a young boy consigned and dedicated to Temple service. Samuel heard the Voice of God. He thought it was Eli, his mentor and guardian, who called him. It took three of these calls before Eli realized that Samuel was hearing the Voice of God. So Eli told Samuel how to respond and what to say. Samuel responded with the fourth call – And he became one of the greatest prophets in the Old Testament!

In the Gospel selection, John the Baptist recognized who and what Jesus was. He pointed out Jesus as "the Lamb of God" to two of his own disciples. Those disciples followed Jesus. They understood that Jesus might be the long-awaited Messiah. Later, Andrew invited Simon, his brother, to meet Jesus. The Baptist had always listened to God's call. The disciples did as well in this instance. Furthermore, they all risked a great deal in response to that call – Because the Baptist and these first disciples took a chance when

they believed that Jesus was sent by God. Eventually, the disciples left everything to be the followers of Jesus.

However, mistakenly, they thought that the Messiah would inaugurate the new Kingdom of Israel. But Jesus came to establish the much greater – the everlasting – Kingdom of God! For this Kingdom, they would, eventually, sacrifice even their lives in martyrdom.

Responding to the Voice of God always means some risk. Often it will mean giving up things we thought were important. Responding to God means separating ourselves from: our material wants – our worldly wants – our cultural wants. It means setting aside whatever gets in the way of God's plan for us. What is so sad is that many people risk truly godly things to get what the culture says is more important. They sacrifice their deepest spiritual needs to get what they want materially!

St. Paul was speaking about this in his First Letter to the Corinthians. They were focused - perhaps even addicted - to their erotic desires. They were in erotic relationships that were immoral. They had been using their pursuits. bodies for trulv ungodly Consequently, Paul reprimanded them. He told them that with their Baptism, they were now part of the body of Jesus Christ! They were one with Jesus, himself! Their bodies were temples of the Holy Spirit! Therefore, they must live up to this wonderful gift. They must glorify God who has created them ransomed them from satan's power - and adopted them as His own children! For they were brothers and sisters of – and in – Jesus Christ, His Son!

Brothers and Sisters, despite what the culture and the advertisers want us to believe – we were created for much more than what they are trying to sell. We were made for a life that transcends this culture and this world – We were made for God. Furthermore, we are being called, every day, by God, Himself.

So let us pray that we can hear that call – May we respond wholeheartedly to whatever God asks – And may we understand that our reward from God is worth infinitely more than this world has to offer!
