# Third Ordinary Sunday January 21, 2024 "Our Plans and God's Plans"

By the time they are in the sixth grade, most Western children have ideas about their future. They have serious thoughts about what vocation, and what occupation, they might like to pursue. Most take it for granted that they will be married with a family. Most also have thoughts about their personal careers.

How these goals are achieved depends upon many factors. Some take a great deal of personal sacrifice – Some require the cost of an extended education – And some are never achieved because circumstances arise which prevent them.

However, what most people never consider is what God wants them to do – what God's plan for them might be. God, certainly, has something unique and special for each of us to accomplish. And God often surprises us when He intervenes in our plans for our own life!

The Book of Jonah is a case in point. The Ninevites were the hated enemies of the Chosen People. They had plundered and wreaked havoc on Israel and Judea for several generations. Nevertheless, God created them and wanted them to change. Consequently, God commanded Jonah to preach conversion to them. But Jonah was a reluctant prophet. He resisted God in every way possible. Yet, God intervened with a storm, potential shipwreck, and a great sea monster. God even gave the Ninevites the grace of repentance!

Jonah could not escape God's plan for him – no matter how hard he tried. He even became angry with God. But God wanted Jonah and all of Israel to learn an important truth – It was that the Lord, their God, was the God of every people and every nation. Moreover, salvation was possible for everyone – provided they converted their hearts and changed their ways!

In the Gospel account, Peter, Andrew, James, and John were all related. They

were also members of the Zebedee Fishing Company. They had always thought that fishing would be the source of their livelihood. Then, suddenly, everything changed. God intervened with His Son. Jesus entered their lives and called them to a new kind of fishing. He would teach them how to catch people. Henceforth, they would be catching men, women, and children for God's Company – the Kingdom of Heaven!

When Paul wrote to the Corinthians, he believed that the Second Coming of Christ

and the End of the World – were imminent. This is the reason he tells the Corinthians to reconsider everything in the light of this belief. They must prepare themselves – They must understand that the things of this world are secondary – and only temporary. Whatever they do must be done in the light of God's will – and the Final Coming of Jesus – Because this world was about to end – It would be replaced by something much more wonderful and everlasting!

Brothers and Sisters, God's time was not Paul's time. The End of our World can come at any time. However, God is always present for us. God is always calling us to something special and unique. God has something for us in every encounter with people, with the activities of this world – and with nature itself.

What is important is: that we become less attached to the things of this world – that we relinquish our grasp on ungodly things – that we ask for the guidance of the Holy Spirit in every decision we make – that we understand that God created everyone in His image – that He loves even our worst enemies – that He forgives us no matter what we have done if we are sorry – that He calls us to far more than what our world, here, can ever offer!

So, let us pray, today, that we can become more than we, presently, are – May we be open to every whisper of God in our heart and soul – And may we, ultimately, inherit the Kingdom that Jesus came to establish – the Kingdom of Heaven!
