

#### My Dear Parishioners,

Anyone who has ever had to deal with teenagers knows the foot-dragging that can go on over a simple request to do something. "Mark, please take the garbage out;" "Just let me finish this video game!" or "Joanna, you promised to walk the dog;" "Not right now;" "Can't it wait?" "I'll do it in a minute!" To their frustration, parents discover that an adolescent

"minute" can last for hours, while the young person learns that the great strategy for escaping what one dislikes doing now is promising to do it later.

In today's Gospel Jesus tells of two sons asked by their father to work in his vineyard. The one who said "Later" actually went and did the work, while the other agreed to go but did not. To our surprise, Jesus is not concerned about which son in the story procrastinated, but about the larger issue of how people were responding to his teaching. As we know from many Gospel passages, even Jesus' closest disciples sometimes had difficulty paying attention to him and grappled with the meaning of his words. And in the places Jesus visited, the people who thought of themselves as good Jews were reluctant to respond to him or even turned away from him entirely. The people whom the "good" Jews shunned, such as tax collectors and prostitutes, were not only hearing Jesus but immediately following him. They had grasped a great truth: wholeheartedly doing God's will is of far greater importance than simply following religious laws and commandments and offers an inner freedom and peace of heart like nothing else. For whatever reason, some of us go through the motions of being a Christian, but never take it to heart. Are you like this? What's making you drag your feet? Become a real disciple today.

Begin living stewardship now—The best way to be a follower of Jesus Christ is to be with other believers. **Strengthen your faith by joining us at Mass frequently** - your presence at the Eucharistic table makes the biggest difference; connect with a parish group that prays, studies, or serves together. Look in the parish bulletin or one of our flyer handouts to find what would suit you best.

Obey and respect others. Follow Jesus!
