Future of Holy Trinity School Building: During the HT Finance Council meeting on Oct.17, the main issue discussed was the future of old school. In the previous months, concerned people expressed the need to maintain the building for historical purposes. For that reason, there was a third party's

proposal for purchasing and developing apartments, requiring some spots for parking in front and side, boundaries marked and utilities separated. The estimate for demolition comes to \$250,000.00 and it is a lot of money. So what is the best option we can take? We wish to hold an open forum for the parishioners in the months ahead.
