## "Honor and Respect"

The institution of marriage in our day continues to have a failure rate of over 50%. Marriages tend to fail in their first or second year – or in the 8th to 10th year. This high failure rate is truly discouraging – Because those who wed have such high hopes and dreams in the beginning.

One of the reasons marriages fail is that one or both partners is lacking in respect for the other. Another is the failure to communicate honestly and candidly. Each must truly learn and understand what the other thinks and feels. And a respectful spouse will honor those viewpoints and feelings. However, probably, the most important reason that marriages fail is that the spouses have left God out of the partnership. If God is not central, then any marriage is on shaky ground.

God always brings a deep and spiritual dimension to any marriage. Moreover, if the spouses honor God – then they are disposed to honor one another! All the scriptures for today teach us many things regarding marriage and family life.

Abraham and Sarah were childless. God had promised Abraham a son. He had promised ancestors like the sand on the seashore and the stars in the heavens. Yet, no child was born until the couple were in their nineties! What kept Abraham and Sarah hopeful was their faith and trust.

Over the course of many years, they, gradually, learned that God was to be trusted completely. God's ways and times were not those of Abraham and Sarah. Nevertheless, God's plan always unfolded for them when they had the patience to wait and trust!

Today, the Gospel of Luke teaches us how important it is to honor God's plan for our children. Unfortunately, one of the serious mistakes that parents can make is to overly control their children's lives. Parents can hope and plan that their children will – follow exactly in their footsteps – that they take over the family business – or enter a particular job or profession. And it can be a disappointment when the children choose a different path.

The selection from St. Luke also revealed something about the future of Mary and Joseph's son. Jesus would be the reason for the rise and fall of many in Israel. Jesus and what he taught would also be a sign contradiction! The religious of leadership, the powerful, and the wealthy would reject Jesus and his message. How could a mere carpenter from Nazareth be the Son of God? How could he spend so much time with the poor - and the outcasts like the prostitutes and the tax collectors? How could he dare to reach out and touch lepers and the dead? Truly, all these behaviors contradicted who and what the leadership believed the Messiah would be!

Simeon also foretold that a terrible sword would pierce the heart of Mary. This pain would begin whenever Jesus met with

opposition. It would be completed when Jesus was condemned, rejected, and crucified!

Brothers and Sisters, we are all members of a biological family. But we are also members of the extended family of the world community. We are all God's children. And God has a plan and a destiny for every one of us. Consequently, it is truly tragic whenever people don't respect one another. It is shameful when violence disrupts family life – disturbs the peace of the local community – destroys cities and nations – because of the selfishness of those who are self-centered!

The only answer to all the violence in the world is to open ourselves to the plan of God. We must become, truly, people of prayer. We must pray that, somehow, the anger, the hatred, the violence in people's hearts will be changed. We must learn to see that every person, everywhere, is one of God's children. No matter how terrible their actions, they are still a member of the universal family that God has created.

So, let us pray, today, that each one of us can become a sign of contradiction in our broken world – May each of us bring God's peace and loving kindness to everyone around us – And may every married couple bring something of Mary and Joseph into their family life!
