SJ Montini Hall Front project: In September 2022 St. Joseph's Church, Rushford Finance council initiated the rebuilding of Montini Hall front due to deteriorating situation of the old structure. Most of the work was done in winter and only the landscaping work is being taken up now. In the last two years this work urgently needed to be done. Thanks to a donor who gave \$45,000 for this work to be done. Our initial estimate for concrete work of the steps and ramp was \$25,000 but other things like Tarp and heat for winter, Replace of Gas line, landscaping, railing came up later. Therefore, the project estimates rose to a cost of \$70,133. An amount of \$25,133 is being utilized from the church fund. The Bishop's Board has approved the project. Free will donations in memory of loved ones are welcome and appreciated. Thanks to all who have given their time, treasure and talent to keep our church facilities in good shape.

My Dear Parishioners,

"Without cost you have received; without cost you are to give," says Jesus in today's Gospel (Matthew 10:8). It is a common belief these days that people have absolute authority over their possessions. The truth is that whatever we have has ultimately come from God's hands, and not solely from our own efforts.

A child will say, "This is my bedroom." Yet the room is part of the house the parents own, and the child has temporary custody of it. So it is for all of us as people of faith. Our lives and everything we have are at the disposal of the God who has redeemed us. In our culture, a person's bank account is no one else's business. In a similar way, many Christians say that their giving is a private matter, information to which only God is privy. A few even try to justify this with Jesus' statement, "When you give alms, do not let your left hand know what your right is doing" (Matthew 6:3). But Jesus is referring to our inner motives for giving—to please God rather than impress other people—and not granting us the privilege of privacy.

If you find yourself insisting that some part of your spiritual life is nobody else's business, it may be a warning sign that you are trying to hide something. Keep in mind that the Lord Jesus gave his life not to provide a private relationship with each of us, but to make for himself a church of people consecrated to him. This church shares the responsibility for spreading the Good News of the gospel as well as the spiritual growth of its members. This means that we must be honest and accountable with God and with one another other about how we handle God's money.
