**St. Rose of Lima Pastoral Council Meeting** is Thursday July 27 at 6:00pm in the Hall.

St. Rose Finance Council Meeting Report June 28, 2023: Reviewed and approved finance statements for May after seeking clarifications. Took note of St. Anthony's Church, Altura account balances, distributions and closure. Decided to have an improved budget planning. Took note of long term planning committee's proposals which need attention in one year like Rubber roof replacement over church, church Hall basement water issue, chimney removal to below roof line, adding new spots at handicap accessible parking, handicap seating in church, find new licensed boiler operator.

To request proxy from the Diocese for spending over \$25K limit, updated on the progress of Catholic Ministries Appeal 2023, evaluated participants views of Eucharistic Congress and considered increase of staff pay. Next meeting planned for September.

**St. Rose of Lima Church Roof issue that we need to fix soon**: The existing rubber roof is over 20 years old and is well over-due for replacement. Earlier this spring I inspected the roof and found an 8" tear. This tear (and a few other smaller ones) were fixed by the roofing company. The roofing company owner mentioned that our rubber church roof will last about one more year. This makes it a priority. The roofer gave us an estimate to replace the roof of approximately \$75,000. We have also asked Merit Roofing out of Rochester, MN to provide us with an estimate – which is \$196,083.

The Finance Council reviewed and unanimously decided in June along with the two trustees to get the work done in the summer months for \$75,000. We have sent requested to the Bishop for a proxy as the overall cost has gone above the \$25,000 limit. We ask you to contribute generously to keep our church building in good shape. - Gregory Bronk, Chair for Maintenance Committee.

### My Dear Parishioners,

Reflecting on God's Word this Sunday, I pictured the straight rows of crops growing tall and healthy at this time of year. We know that farmers plant very carefully to guarantee the highest yield. But that's not the way the farmer in today's parable plants. This farmer takes a big risk, it seems. Throwing seed around indiscriminately, some of it falls on the rocks, some on the road, some in the brambles, and, inevitably, some falls on good, cultivated soil. Yet, even though many of the seeds die, this foolish farmer's crop yields a hundred Omes what was to be expected.

This is how God sows the Word. Like the seed, the Word of God is to be scattered indiscriminately over the whole earth, without regard to where the good soil is that can receive and nurture it. Even though the Word does not take root everywhere, Isaiah tells us "it shall not return to me void, but shall do my will, achieving the end for which I sent it." And Paul reminds us that the whole world will "share in the glorious freedom of the children of God."

Our next step is to consider what message God has for us in these readings—how we are to live God's Word—how indeed are Christians to respond to this "foolish" God? We must ask ourselves if we are allowing God's Word to take root deep in our hearts and produce an abundant yield. We must ask ourselves if we are too stingy with the good news, fearful of being rejected. And then we must pray. Pray every day. Pray in every circumstance—for guidance, in thanksgiving, with love.

Keep smiling.
