- 5. Exit after the priest and servers, preferably at the conclusion of the recessional hymn.

With tenderness and love we pray for our deceased, Wilma Mueller of Wilson. She will be laid to rest on August 23rd at 11am, at Immaculate Conception Church. May her loved ones find comfort and reassurance in God, our Father.

Saint Rose of Lima (1585-1617), heavenly Patroness of our parish whom we venerate, imitate, and follow her example.

Rose was born in Lima in 1585, 11th child of Spanish-Indian parents. From early days, when she was barely able to walk, she was found to be lost in contemplation before the big crucifix in her mother's room. When Rose was 12 years old wished to consecrate herself to God. After a difficult path, she received the habit and the St. Dominic tertiary rule of life.

She and her brother Ferdinand built a tiny hermitage in her father's garden to live there. Though Rose was a working girl, to help support the family, she made her work a means of union with God. She was spending hours at night in prayer. She used to go into a state of ecstasy a great deal of time. After Mass used to go into ecstasy for hours not conscious of people who crowded around to watch her. She also suffered periods of spiritual desolation. Rose prayed for the missions and deliverance of people. Rose died early age of 31 in 1617. People considered her a saint, the church canonized her in 1671, the first canonized saint of the Americas.

Dear Parishioners,

Reflecting on God's Word in this Sunday's Gospel the phrase "Beggars can't be choosers!" came to mind. "Beggars can't be choosers!" we might say to a child who asks for a different candy bar from the one we have handed him. "Beggars can't be choosers!" we might think as we watch a struggling mother sort through hand-me-downs at the free store. "Beggars can't be choosers!" we might tell ourselves when we are mistreated by someone, we rely on to supply our needs. Those four little words may seem logical and harmless. Yet, how many children, unemployed, elderly, sick, or otherwise vulnerable people have lost their self-respect and stopped voicing their needs because they believe those four little words!

Today's scriptures challenge us to stop using, or even thinking, those four words. They invite us to see that, yes, beggars can and should be choosers. The first and second readings seem directed to those who feel they deserve better than others.

They show God's mercy extending to all who call on and love the name of the Lord, and remind us that all of us have disobeyed, thus all of us are beggars. The Gospel speaks to those who feel they deserve worse than others. The Canaanite woman is held up as a model to imitate, not someone to be scorned and rejected. We are encouraged never again to let feelings of unworthiness convince us that our needs don't deserve a hearing, respect, and a response.

As we ponder living God's Word, consider the Canaanite woman who seems to convert Jesus by expressing faith in him and faith in herself. How might we express our faith in God, in others, and in ourselves? How might God use our faith to convert others?
