Lenten Practices: Gospels introduce five basic attitudes as the foundation upon which the Reign of God is both revealed and fostered. These serve humanity as the principal means through which God teaches and reveals himself who believers are called to be in the world.

1. Love is at the heart of relationships that care, nurture, and sustain us as God's people. As created in the image and likeness of God, we express our divinity through every act of love, and most especially through every act where we do not fear to love. 2. Forgiveness means to forgive everyone everything - never holding anything back to use later. It is transformative. Evangelical forgiveness challenges us to remember the great things that God has done for us, making forgiveness easy to receive and to give. 3. Merciful means to move far beyond mere pity. Mercy is knowing a person truly, it is to walk a mile in another's shoes. To open ourselves to deeper purposes and truths within and all around all that is. 4. To Give some more of our time, gifts, humanity, our care and compassion to each other. When the wonder and beauty of creation that lies beyond its pain and brokenness is revealed, then we cannot help but give ourselves to it. 5. To not judge means accept the God given persons who have their own struggles to go through in life. It is a prescription for how to live in the world. When we forget our place in creation and attempt to become like God in ways that are not ours to become. For judgment belongs to God alone.
