Chapter 3: Real Presence in the Fathers
This chapter is packed full of treasures. Dr. Tim
O'Malley states on page 39, From the seeds of sacred
scripture, the doctrine of Eucharistic presence
develops over the first 500 years of the Church... This
chapter presents the development of Eucharistic
presence in the early Church up to St. Augustine...
The development of the doctrine of real presence as
an encounter with Christ's personal presence is linked
to the:

- 1. Historical reality of martyrdom,
- 2. Attention to the material nature of salvation,
- 3. The transformation of the Eucharistic elements and our senses,
- 4. The Eucharistic nature of the Church.

Here are a few sentences from chapter 3 that explain the Eucharist from the Church Fathers:

--The Blood of Christ... (reflects) the early Eucharistic meals of the Church, a love feast that precipitates the union between Christ and all believers. —Eating is vital to human life. And bread and wine become body and blood so that there may be an intimate communion of the human body with the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. —Through eating the transformed bread and wine, the new Christian becomes a "Christ-bearer." The members of the Christian's body are transformed, participating now in divine life.

My Dear Parishioners,

In today's gospel Jesus warns us that he has not come to abolish the law but to fulfill it.

Just because God loves us does not mean God has to do what we want. We can't manipulate God or guilt-trip God into doing what we want. It's humbling for us to realize that we are not entitled to God's favor. God chooses to help us with perfect freedom from a place of pure love. The law that God gave to us was not meant to limit us but to ensure we use our freedom in a way that is good for us and for others.

Love requires freedom, and freedom means we have to respect the other person's ability to say "no" to us. If we truly desire to be in a mature relationship with God, then we need to respect this freedom and ensure we use our freedom in a way that is good for us and for others.

As we celebrate the Eucharist, a sacrifice made freely on our behalf, let us repent the times we have trespassed against God and our neighbor and embrace the gift of God's law and the true freedom to which it leads us.
