

"Real Presence: What Does It Mean and Why Does It Matter?" Book Study

Chapter 2: Real Presence in the Scriptures

Dr. Tim O'Malley states that real presence is about the intimate communion of God with men and women. This chapter presents essential moments of God's presence to men and women in the scriptures.

Highlighted are the numerous Bible verses explaining the Eucharist, both in the Old and New Testaments. In his conclusion on page 37, "The scriptures narrate the intimate presence of the God who comes to dwell among mortals. This personal presence begins with God hearing the cries of Israel, leading to the formation of Israel as a people, the gift of the Law and manna from heaven, the Temple cult, the pain of absence, and eventually the hope for restoration. In the New Testament, one hears how Jesus is the very presence of God made flesh. The Eucharist functions as a way of bringing Christians into union with the sacrifice of Christ, as well as uniting them more deeply to one another. The richness of this promised presence, of the union with God made possible through Christ, is precisely what the Fathers of the Church take up in their explication of the Eucharist."

My Dear Parishioners,

In today's reading from the Letter to the Corinthians Paul says it is the power of God working through him, not his own wisdom or talents, that allowed the Corinthians to put their faith in the gospel. The Corinthians themselves were so self-satisfied and proud about their gifts that they had forgotten who gave them what they had and what their gifts were for. Paul reminds them, and us, that everything we have—even our faith—is from the Lord and for others. It is the Lord's light that shines through those who, like Paul, put their trust in God. To walk in that light is to allow God's generosity, mercy, and justice to shine through us. And that means sharing all we have, as individuals and as a community, the way God has done and continues to do for us.

The Second Vatican Council's Dogmatic Constitution on the Church is entitled *Lumen Gentium*, “Light of the Nations,” because that is what the Church is called to be. Christ's light is given to us—not only for our own personal benefit now or salvation someday—but that others might “see the light” and turn their gaze and their lives toward the dawning Sun of Justice: Christ, our Light.

A dancer named Lillian is always saying, “Give it up,” and she doesn't mean, “Throw up your hands in despair.” She means, “Whatever you have, share it for the good of all.” Isn't that what God has done for us in Christ crucified, and wants to do through us, the Body of Christ? ~ Keep smiling.
