**Season of Lent:** The annual observance of Lent is the special season for the ascent to the holy mountain of Easter. Catechumens are led to the sacraments of initiation through the rite of election, the scrutinies and catechesis. **"Real Presence: What Does It Mean and Why Does It Matter?"** Book Study

Discussion: Chapter 4

Reminder of Group Discussion Times:

**Chptr. 4:** Savoring The Mystery of Transubstantiation

Here are some sentences from Chapter 4 to review. Dr. Tim O'Malley states on page 69 - What is available in the Eucharist is Christ's personal presence. Bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ. What is adored is Christ's Body. Cistercian Alan of Lille in 1180 describes Eucharistic change on page 70: "Transubstantiation is that type of change according to which both the matter and the substantial form are changed, while the accidents remain." The substance of bread and wine are no more, becoming the substantial presence of Jesus Christ. The language of substance and accident or, more preferably species or appearance in formal doctrinal teaching allowed the Church to understand the real presence of Christ without falling into gross materialism or a figural symbolism that disallows adoration of the Blessed Sacrament. Thomas Aquinas' poem/hymn "Lauda sion" is structured around Eucharistic time and offers a poetically rich account of what happens in the transubstantiation of bread and wine into Christ's Body and Blood. It starts with the past of the Last Supper, next is the Eucharistic presence of Christ's sacrifice, & then a foretaste of the beatific
