"The Only Way to God"

We live in a world of duplicity. It is a world of double standards and selfishness. And while there are countless good people around us – the honest and sincere ones have a very difficult time.

Many people do only the minimum. They cut corners wherever they can. Others are very angry in their relationships – and with life itself. They are always on the verge of exploding. Still others, seek only to satisfy themselves. They have no concern for the harm they do to others.

Nevertheless, why do some people refuse to succumb to the ways of the culture and the world? How is it that some never compromise on the important choices? Today's scriptures have much to teach us regarding what we have considered thus far.

Sirach reveals that keeping God's Commandments is the only way to salvation. God's Commandments are only an outline for how He expects us to live and behave. However, we all have free will. We can choose to abide by those Commandments or not! If we keep them, we will possess the water of life now and in the future. If we do not, then the fury of fire will always sear our souls and our lives!

Unfortunately, we come into the world with damaged DNA. This is due to the Original Sin of our first parents. They chose the easy way, the attractive way, the pleasurable way, the selfish way. And they lost so much in doing so. Unfortunately, we continue to pay the same price whenever we sin in even the smallest way.

In the Gospel of Matthew, Jesus teaches us that God's Commandments have great depth and nuance. We must be better than the scribes and Pharisees of his time. Most of them lived lives of

duplicity. They kept every legality - But their minds, hearts, and lives were lacking in love, care, and concern for others.

Consequently, Jesus reminds us that murder is wrong. But so are other things we do that hurt others and bring pain to them. Demeaning others, calling them names, harboring hatred and animosity are just some examples. Yet, all these sins of our heart and mind are known to God! Because Sirach also said – God knows and sees all things – even those never spoken or acted upon.

Jesus also teaches us that adultery is always wrong. But so are the thoughts, desires, and behaviors that compromise the procreative act in any way. Thus, pornography and all LGBTQ+ lifestyles are forbidden – for they destroy our souls!

Furthermore, we must cut ourselves off from all other enticements as if they were an eye, or a hand, figuratively speaking. Thus, the choices are before us: the easy way now or the hard way of self-denial that leads to eternal life!

It's tragic that divorce is so prevalent in our Western world today. True marriage can never be a contract as most suppose it to be. Contracts can be broken – hence, the high divorce rate. Authentic marriage is a covenant. It is like what God has with us. It can't be broken. It continues to exist no matter what the other party believes or does! However, covenants require maturity and self-integration. Marriages fail because these essentials were absent.

Finally, Jesus urges us to never use subterfuge or insincerity when we speak. Our word must be our bond. "Yes" or "No" are words that no one should be afraid to say!

Brothers and Sisters, the Gospel way of Jesus is never easy. Nevertheless, St. Paul gives us great encouragement and hope. The Wisdom behind God's plan is not the wisdom of the world. God's Wisdom is mysterious. It is filled with wonderful, hidden realities. It surpasses even the wildest dreams that we can imagine. For "Eye has not seen, ear has not heard, nor has it even entered into our hearts what God has prepared for those who love Him"!

So, let us strive always to do God's will - When we fail with our sins, let us repent and change - Let us sever any ties that impede our journey - And may God continue to bless us in His Mysterious Ways! Amen.
