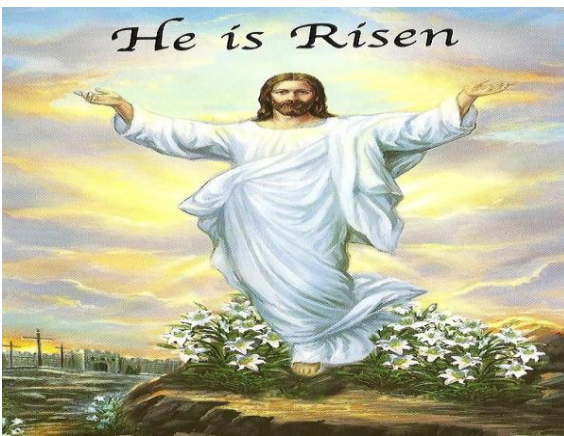

"God's Chosen Ones"

What does it mean to be chosen? What are the implications for someone who is selected for a special role? What are the obligations that come with being privileged and blessed? Of course, we can refuse to accept being singled out. We can assert that we don't want the honor or the responsibilities. We can refuse to commit ourselves to something about which we remain unconvinced!

These are the considerations that everyone in the Promised Land had to ponder 2000 years ago.

The Son of God had entered our world. He was present in the person of Jesus, the carpenter turned Rabbi from the town of Nazareth.

In the Acts of the Apostles, Peter addressed the crowd that had gathered on Pentecost Sunday. He summed up for them everything that had happened in the past three years. He told them that Jesus of Nazareth was someone chosen and sent from God - That he spoke a wonderful message - That he went about curing people's bodies and healing their souls. He said that Jesus came for everyone - That Jesus was the answer to the deepest hopes and dreams of every human being - That we could be forgiven - That our worst crimes and failures would no longer haunt us - That we were meant for infinitely more than any life here - That eternal life awaits us after we die!

Consequently, everyone was called - everyone was invited. Everyone was chosen. Everyone was potentially privileged. Yet, there were conditions. We had to believe in Jesus - We had to accept every aspect of the Gospel. We had to be sorry for our sins and repent of our former ways! It is obvious that no one expected or believed that Jesus would rise from the dead.

Many had hoped that he was a political leader - that he would deliver them from Roman domination. Others saw him as an upstart not to be trusted. The religious leadership saw Jesus as a threat to their customs and traditions. And his disciples saw him as a beloved friend who was unjustly condemned and crucified!

But all this changed that first Easter morning. Mary Magdalene went to complete the burial anointing with the herbs and spices. But the tomb had been opened and the body of Jesus was gone! Mary summoned Peter and John who went to see for themselves. And then John began to believe. He began to understand all that Jesus was. Because the scriptures had foretold that God's Chosen One would not be abandoned to Shaol - Nor would his body undergo decay or corruption!

During the ensuing days and weeks, many of the disciples experienced the Risen Jesus in person. They ate and drank with him - They realized that they were chosen, blessed, and privileged. Furthermore, they understood that they had obligations. They were to continue the ministry of Jesus. They were to give people hope and courage to face life and human existence in a faith-filled way.

Brothers and Sisters, we are chosen ourselves. We are blessed and privileged in wonderful ways. We have been gifted with faith and belief. The fact that we are here today is a sign. We, too, have a part to play in God's plan. In some way, we must bear witness to Jesus and his mission. We are called to be signs of hope in a broken world. It is a world dominated by the nihilism of unbelief - and the corruption of self-indulgent self-centeredness.

So let us pray that we are continually graced for this task - May the Risen Christ always be the Master whom we follow - And may our journey with him bring us into his Eternal Kingdom when our time comes! Amen.
