“Changed to Become Something More”

Many years ago, there lived a man in a small, but growing, city. The man was a neighborhood shoe repairman. He was always kind, considerate, and very creative with all of his customers. But, suddenly, one day he was gone. He was away for at least a year or two. Then, one day, he returned. However, he was almost unrecognizable! His appearance changed so much, that it was hard to believe that he was the same person.

Yet, his voice was the same. And he was even more kind, generous, and creative than before. Something had happened during that time away. Perhaps, it was after a severe trauma – or a nervous breakdown. Nevertheless, he went on to live a full 99 years. He was alert - And he was constantly sought after for his creative ingenuity with leather goods and special clothing! This was even from major corporations, until shortly before he died.

Something like this is what the two disciples experienced on their journey to Emmaus. Jesus met them. He conversed with them. He had a deeper understanding and wisdom about recent events than they had. But they didn't recognize him at all. They offered him their hospitality -They shared a meal together - However, only when Jesus took the bread and blessed it, were their eyes opened! It was Jesus himself who was alive and risen - But he was transformed in some marvelous, unbelievable way!

The reality was so overwhelming, that the two disciples rushed to return the seven miles to Jerusalem. This astounding news was validated by the experience of Peter and the other disciples. Jesus was risen. He continued to live on. But he was no longer bound by the constraints of ordinary space and time!

In the passage from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter took to task all those who had rejected Jesus and his message. These were the leaders who condemned and crucified him. It also included those who shouted for his death before Pilate. Then, Peter recounted

what King David prophesied about Jesus. God would not consign Jesus to the netherworld of emptiness and gloom. Nor would God allow his body to corrupt and disintegrate.

Instead, Jesus was raised to be at the right hand of the Godhead. There he would call forth the Holy Spirit upon all those who believed. That Spirit would continue to work in their minds and hearts. And it would enable them to rise one day to be with all those who had gone before them in faith and hope.

Brothers and Sisters, we must remind ourselves of the moments when we were touched by God. When was the moment we realized that we were made for something infinitely more? When did we change our hearts, truly repent – and experience the mercy of God? Our appearance might not have been changed like the shoemaker I mentioned. But we should have been moved to look to Jesus himself – and for God's plan for us.

Moreover, something divine is always present whenever we come to Mass, break the bread, and share the cup of wine. Because these elements are more than what they appear to be. They are the flesh and blood of the Savior who gave his life for us. Jesus died so that we could live. He rose to enable us to rise someday, ourselves!

And we will certainly rise to infinitely more than anything that we can experience here! So let us thank God for creating us - for redeeming us - and for all that He has destined us to become!
