### **“The Only Love that Truly Unites”**

What are the signs of real love? Real love is certainly not what happens on a “One-Night-Stand”. Nor is it present in any selfish erotic relationship. Real love is something powerful in the heart and soul of a person. It is something that always seeks the well-being of the beloved. It is characterized by the willingness to sacrifice for another. Ultimately, it is the willingness even to lay down one’s life for someone else!

Thus, love for comrades is often proved in battle. Loving parents are continually sacrificing their needs for their children. And life-long spouses become uniquely one in the true love that has united them. Probably the most certain sign of authentic love is always to do things that please the other person. And this is what Jesus asked of his disciples in the Gospel of John.

If we truly love Jesus, then we keep his commandments. And the core of his commandments is to love others as Jesus has loved us! A wonderful thing happens when love is authentic. It unites people in ways they never thought were possible. Jesus tells us that his love for the Father unites him to the Father. Consequently, if we love Jesus, we, too, will be united with the Father - Because Jesus and the Father are one in some marvelous all-embracing way!

Jesus also said that he would not leave us as orphans. Therefore, if we love him, we are never abandoned, cut-off, or stranded – We are never disenfranchised or alone! And the reason is that Jesus has sent us the Advocate. This Advocate is the Holy Spirit. And the Advocate is the Love of the Father and the Son for each other. This Spirit is available to direct and guide believers who are one with Jesus and the Father who sent him.

Thus, it was the Holy Spirit who led and directed Philip to Samaria. Philip understood

that Jesus came and died for everyone, including Samaritans. The Samaritans were despised and shunned by the Jews who needed to learn and accept the Gospel message of universal love.

The Samaritans accepted the Gospel and were baptized. But more was needed. Consequently, Peter and John went to them. They confirmed them in their new-found faith. And so it was that they received the Holy Spirit of love and unity with all true believers!

Next Sunday we will commemorate the Ascension of Jesus. The Ascension marks his departure from this material world into the invisible Kingdom of the Father. However, Jesus did not leave us spiritual orphans as mentioned before - Because the following Sunday is Pentecost.

The Holy Spirit will be unleashed again in the hearts and souls of all who believe and love authentically. It is tragic that we live in a world which continues to be unaware of God’s love. It is a world that is ruled by self-centered ego-centrism. It cares little or nothing about the welfare of others – It is guided only by self-interest in power, wealth, and pleasure. It continues to be on a path to self-destruction in ways too numerous to mention. It knows nothing of the Holy Spirit and Godly Love. It denies who Jesus is – what he came to do – and the spiritual gifts that are always available.

In his First Letter, St. Peter urges each of us to manifest – to witness to – the Gospel in our own way. Consequently, in every encounter, we are to live and manifest the kindness, care, and concern that Jesus had for others. We are to be patient and forthright if they question us. They might ask for insight into our hearts - They might be seeking explanation and direction for themselves in some way.

However, they might also be trying to trap us or depreciate what we say and believe. In this case, they reveal their own woeful lack of openness to God and the Spirit of God. Nevertheless, we must be willing to suffer if they disparage us in any way.

So, let us pray, Brothers and Sisters, that we may always live united with Jesus, the Father, and the Holy Spirit. For that Spirit is Divine Love that has been poured forth into our hearts! Amen.
