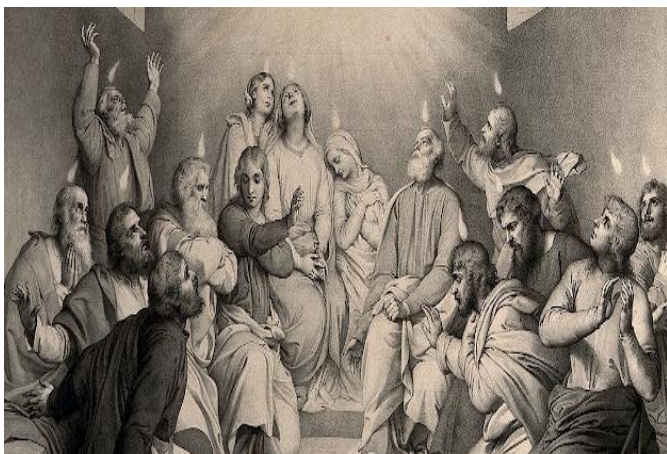

“The Divine Guiding Light”

Most of us have had a major breakthrough at sometime in our life. We might have wondered about what we should do for an occupation – or the courses we should take to prepare us for it. We might have been seeking the right person as a spouse. Perhaps we were caught in a 3-way pull exerted by work, marriage, and parenthood.

And then, suddenly, at some moment, things became very clear. “This is the profession or job in which I will be most fulfilled - These are the courses I should take to prepare for that career. This is the best person with whom I should share the rest of my life - And my children will be best served right now – rather than sometime later.”

There is also a breakthrough that comes in our spiritual life. At some point we realize that God is absolutely and supremely important - That being in a relationship with God supersedes everything else - That we can't be merely “hedging a bet” with God – or doing the bare minimum - That sin truly estranges us from God - That if things are truly right with God – then everything else falls into place - This includes work, occupation, spouse, children – and the worst that life can marshal against us!

This is what the Apostles struggled with after the Resurrection of Jesus. The Master had shown himself alive in some incredible way. He had entrusted them with the task of carrying on his mission. He had given them the Holy Spirit - He told them to stay in Jerusalem and wait. And wait they did. It was probably in that same Upper Room wherein Jesus had given them the Eucharist.

Then, suddenly, on Pentecost Sunday, the Holy Spirit was unleashed! A tornado-like wind shaking the whole house - Tongues of fire which seared their souls and spirits - There was an explosive energy that filled each of them. And all

their doubts, fears, and inertia were stripped away!

From that house's balcony they addressed the gathering crowd. All those who arrived understood and spoke the Hebrew language. Yet, each of them heard the message in the native tongue of their birthplace throughout the Middle East. That message was that Jesus was the Divine Lord of all things - And he had brought salvation to the entire world!

Years later, St. Paul told the Corinthians that we cannot acknowledge that Jesus is Lord without the power of the Holy Spirit. Moreover, that Spirit is behind every Godly thing that we do. Furthermore, the Holy Spirit gives different gifts and talents to different people. Thus, each person has a particular role to fulfill in bringing the salvation of Jesus to the world.

Brothers and Sisters, what was true 2000 years ago is still true today. The Holy Spirit continues to work in our hearts and lives. It is the Holy Spirit who can unleash the dormant abilities within each of us. That Spirit can make us better spouses, better parents, better vowed religious, clergy or single people.

It can guide us into the vocation, work, or occupation best suited to us. The Holy Spirit can enhance our work by being a divine guiding light. It can inspire our ideas and creativity - It can enhance our interpersonal relationships - It can strengthen our stand against the selfish, myopic, exploitive and erotic aspects of our culture's moral bankruptcy!

So let us learn always to be open to the Holy Spirit - May that Spirit continue to guide us in every aspect of our life - And may we be eternally grateful for Jesus, himself, who fulfilled all that the Father asked of him! Amen.
