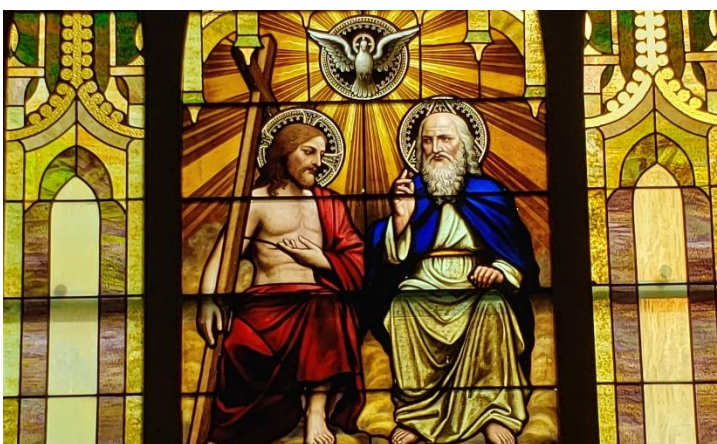

## “Our Innate God-Given Abilities”

There is a great challenge that we all have to face throughout our lives. It is being aware of our own limitations – and the limitations of others as well.

A great example of this happened during the Korean War nearly 75 years ago. A young sergeant was in charge of a forward artillery squad. Somehow, all the misfits in the unit were sent to his gun position. However, the sergeant had a gift for bringing out the best in others. He analyzed each misfit. And then, he put that soldier in charge of just one thing.

The irony is that his squad became the best gunners in the entire regiment! He called his approach “The Rat-Man Theory” - Because one of his soldiers could only kill the rats that infested their bunker. Yet he did that exceedingly well!

All the scriptures for today reveal how wonderful and patient God is in our regard. God created each of us for a purpose. Our challenge is to discover what role we must perform in God’s plan. It will always be in the time and place in which we find ourselves. Allied to this is that we must not wrangle and fight over what we expect from others beyond their capabilities.

St. Paul alludes to this when he exhorts us to mend our ways. We are to change ourselves. We are to encourage one another – trying to understand what God wants from each of them. This also means finding ways to agree with others. It means, at least, being able to disagree without becoming disagreeable or unpleasant ourselves. For this is what it will take to live in peace as members of family, church, nation, and world!

We are certainly fortunate that the Lord God is so patient and loving in our regard. God revealed this to Moses on Mt. Sinai. Moses bowed down and hid his face as God proclaimed that He was Lord and Master of all things. He was merciful and gracious. He was slow to anger. He was rich in His kindness and faithfulness! Consequently, Moses could beg for His forgiveness. He did this on behalf of the whole Israelite community.

St. Paul also teaches us that God is a Trinity of Persons. In some unfathomable and mysterious way, God is One - yet, three Divine Persons comprise the unity of the same one God. In this Blessed Trinity there is a Father/Creator - There is a Son who is the Divine Word that the Father speaks - There is also a Holy Spirit of Divine

Energy and Love. And Trinity continues to work throughout the world today. The Trinity embraces each of us - It works in marvelous ways in our hearts and lives!

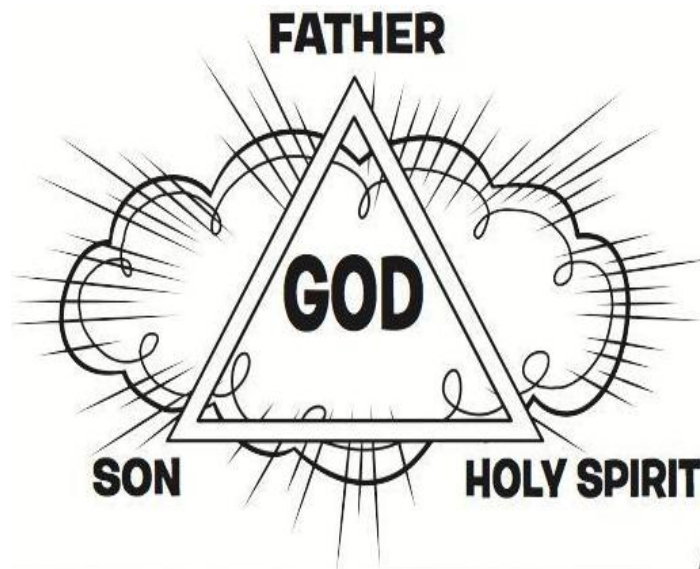
Furthermore, the Word/Son became man in the humanity of Jesus of Nazareth. And Jesus sacrificed his human life so that we could begin to live on a divine level. However, Jesus also revealed that we must believe in him in order to be saved. That belief means repenting of our sins. It means changing what is unGodly in our hearts and lives. It means living by the Gospel message of Jesus. It means having a personal relationship with Jesus who is brother to each of us. And it means seeing every person in the world community as brothers and sisters of each of us as well.

It is truly sad that our world continues to suffer in so many terrible ways. So much of that suffering results from selfish people making excessive and unreasonable demands upon others. They see others as less than they truly are. Or they expect them to be more than God ever intended them to be. The selfish also want more for themselves than God ever destined them to possess - This is especially in the areas of power, control, and wealth.

Our prayer today should be that each of us becomes more like the Trinity itself. For it is in the image of God that we were created!

And so, may the grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, the Love of God the Father, and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with all of us now and forever! Amen.
