### **“Jesus, The Word and Bread of God”**

Life is full of challenges. How a person meets these challenges is an indication of something deeper. It is a measure of their soul and spirit. Mastering subject matter in school is a challenge. Grades are some measures of the time spent in committed study. Marriage is a challenge. To remain faithful and committed for a lifetime is not without hardship and trial. Being a parent is also a great challenge - For being present to children requires great selflessness over many years.

The depth of every person's soul and spirit is proved by their willingness to undergo challenges and hardships. And the scriptures for today have much to teach us in this regard.

Moses told the Chosen People that God wanted to be certain of their steadfastness and faithfulness. Thus, he kept them in the desert for 40 years. Moreover, they suffered hunger and thirst at various times throughout their journey. Once on the brink of starvation, God gave them the manna. The manna was a bread-like substance that seemed to come from the heavens. It could be found under the plants which harbored a certain insect. But it was edible - And it sustained them. God also provided a spring of water from flinty rock when there was no water anywhere to be found.

All this testing was to determine if the Chosen People were worthy to inherit the Promised Land! They had to have faith. They had to believe in and trust God's Word. Because only God's Word could nourish and sustain their souls and spirits. It alone could enable them to endure every hardship and challenge that lay ahead.

In the Gospel of John, Jesus challenged the people who followed him. He told them that he was the Bread of God that came down from Heaven. His body and blood were the source of nourishment which could sustain them on their life-long spiritual journey. Furthermore, Jesus, alone, was the only one who could join them to God!

Consequently, in some way, his disciples would have to partake of his flesh and blood in order to live forever. For just as Jesus had life because of the Father - so, too, could his disciples live only if they were joined to him. Sadly, Jesus lost many of his followers on that day. They could not accept and live by the words of Jesus. They were afraid to risk their traditions and way of life for something they could not understand!

Nevertheless, Jesus truly is the Divine Word of God. Jesus is the Word of God in human flesh and blood. He is also the living Bread of God's Word. And only in - by and through God's Word is divine life possible for us.

The Apostles were some of the few remaining disciples who believed in the message of Jesus. They resolved to risk everything in faith and trust. They remained faithful despite the challenges of belief, hardship, and pain. Brothers and Sisters, we are never alone in facing the challenges of life. St. Paul teaches us: that we are one with each other - that we are one with Jesus - that we are one with God. This is validated whenever we share the Cup of Blessing and break the Bread at every Eucharist that we attend.

Our life here is truly a test. God tests us so that we can prove our courage, steadfastness, and resolve. Nevertheless, even in the worst of times, we continue to have Jesus in the Eucharist. He is there to unite us to himself, to the Father, and to each other.

So, let us pray that we continue to prove ourselves by our faithfulness. And may we always be sustained and nourished by the Bread and Wine which are Jesus - the Living Word and Bread of God! Amen.
