“Filling the Void Within”

There is a great emptiness in every human being. We are born lacking something of which we only gradually become aware. This emptiness is in our deepest selves – in our souls and spirits. Most adults attempt to fill it in different ways. Some try to fill it with wealth and possessions - Others seek it in a variety of activities - Some look for it in relationships - And still others turn to alcohol and drugs.

Today, most Westerners look at their cell phones. They try to fill their emptiness with Facebook, Twitter, and other A-I offerings. But nothing can or does fill the void within us - Because that terrible emptiness can be filled only with God Himself.

The Gospel of Matthew teaches us that Jesus is the one God sent to give us the direction toward that fulfillment. Jesus observed this great emptiness in the people of the great crowd before him. They were like sheep without a shepherd. They were troubled and abandoned. They were lost - And they had no idea of what could ultimately deliver them.

However, Jesus also knew that he was limited. He had only a short time to bring the Good News – the Gospel – to everyone. Consequently, he chose 12 of his disciples to be Apostles. They would, eventually, bring the message and the miracles of Jesus to the world, far and wide. However, for that first mission, they were to stay out of pagan territory and Samaria. Because the people of Gentile lands had no prior knowledge or understanding of God’s Covenant. And Samaritans would engage them in endless religious debate.

In his Letter to the Romans, St. Paul teaches us of the incredible love that God has for us. We are all sinners - We have all been estranged from God. Our emptiness is our inherent ache for God. Furthermore, we are all hopeless and helpless without God. Nevertheless, God sent His Son in the person of Jesus to ransom us with his death. In his dying, Jesus represented the entire human race past, present, and future. He stood for every person who would ever live at any time. Consequently, the death of Jesus reconciled every one of us to God - It opened the doorway to

salvation. Therefore, if we change, if we repent, if we commit to Godly ways then we can be eternally saved by the life of Jesus. Because the life of Jesus is the divine life of God Himself!

The way we prove our willingness to respond to God’s gifts was foretold to Moses on Mt. Sinai. If we listen to God’s voice - If we keep His Covenant - We become a kingdom of priests - And we become a community of believers! The primary role of any priest is to offer sacrifice, worship, and prayer. It is to give glory, praise, honor, and thanks to God for all God’s gifts!

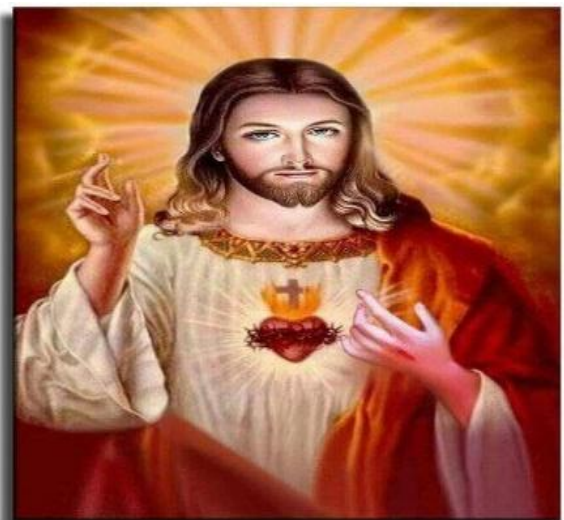
However, what most church goers never realize is that they share in the priesthood of Jesus Christ. We worship together - We pray together - We struggle and suffer together - And we share the Gospel ministry of Jesus by the way we live our lives at each moment of every day.

Moreover, we do this with open and generous hearts. For truly, “without cost have we received” and “without cost are we to give to others” in return!

Brothers and Sisters, nothing on our Earthly journey can fill the empty space within our deepest selves. God alone can do this! Providentially, God doesn’t completely do this while we are here. The reason is that He has infinitely more for us in eternal life which is still to come.

So, let us pray that each of us can become more of a “chosen race”, a “royal priesthood”, a “holy Church”, and a “people set apart” – during whatever time we have here! Amen.
