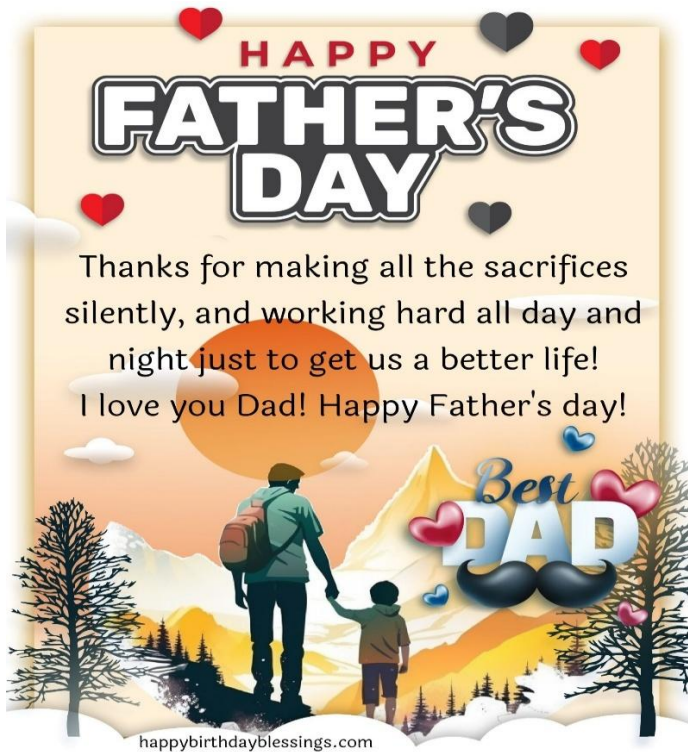

“Overcoming Duplicity”

It's a sad thing to say, but we live in a world of duplicity. Everywhere we turn, people seem to be compromising true values. And we do this even with ourselves. We say something, but often it is to get the favor of someone we want to impress. We say we are Catholics – or Christians - But, secretly, we harbor something that does not square with the Gospel of Jesus.

Usually this is found in our hidden addictions: of alcohol, food, cell phone use, and pornography. Our duplicity is also there when we fail to stand for the truth, goodness, and beauty that manifest God in the world around us.

The scriptures for today remind us that “what goes around, always comes around”. There is nothing that is hidden from the Lord, our God. Moreover, the Lord God knows even the secret depths of our personal hearts and souls.

Jeremiah was a prophet who never compromised anything. He spoke for God. He warned the Chosen People that they faced imminent destruction. They must change their ways or they would lose everything. The ordinary people lived self-centered, indulgent lives. They worshiped false gods. The religious leadership was dominated by political correctness, ambition, and self-service. They refused to promulgate morality and the Commandments of God.

Consequently, they conspired against Jeremiah and God's message. But they paid the price. The nation was conquered - The inhabitants, exiled - Yet, Jeremiah escaped to Egypt with a few who believed and supported him.

In St. Matthew's Gospel, Jesus teaches us how important it is to be a person of complete integrity. There is no escape from the penetrating knowledge of God. There is nothing concealed that won't be revealed. Nor is there anything hidden that will not become known.

Consequently, we must not be afraid to stand for the right things. We, simply, can't go along with the cultural mores of the crowd! Therefore, we must stand against the gradual slipping into our degenerate culture. These are things like immodesty in both men and women - Slothfulness and slovenliness in so many young men - Toleration of the LGBTQ+ lifestyle and values - Believing everything broadcast on AI and the media - Deliberately shortening – or ending – our life ahead of God's time for us.

In much of this, we will stand alone. We will be rejected or disdained by the majority. Nevertheless, God will embrace us with His marvelous providence. Because God knows when sparrows die - And God knows when we suffer – and when death will overtake us. For God has made us for Himself. He made us to share in his unfathomable and overwhelming love in the life to come!

In his letter to the Romans, St. Paul reminds us that all our sinful tendencies come from Adam and his Original Sin. We inherit that sinfulness. We compound it with our own sins and failings. But Jesus is the New Adam. As Adam and Eve brought death to soul and body, Jesus brings grace and eternal life. This is for all who embrace his Gospel way without compromise. For Jesus is the unblemished Lamb of God who takes away our sins and the sins of the world!

Brothers and Sisters, despite our sins, despite our shallowness, our duplicity, our addictions, and our compromises – We must never give up. We must continually seek God's grace. We must break with anyone or anything that leads us astray. We must seek help in a 12-Step Program for any addiction. Because only with the Light of God and solidarity with others can our hidden faults be healed.

So let us pray for God's Light to see the truth of our deepest selves. And may God's grace empower us to conquer anything that is truly unGodly on our journey here! Amen.
