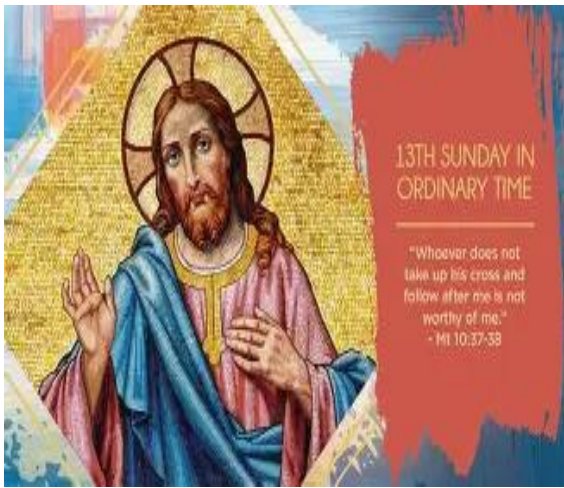

“Goodness and Gifts”

It's a wonderful thing to give a gift to a truly deserving person. We always feel good when we do something special for someone who never expected it. On the other hand, we are put off by someone who asks for something selfishly. In the first case, a person's goodness always attracts us. In the second, their self-centeredness turns us off! So many in our Western culture live self-centered lives. They try to manipulate others with their gift-giving. They try to impress or gain the favor of others for selfish reasons. We see this in the political realm of our own country. And this is especially so around election time. Campaigns are financed in hope of something big in return!

Unfortunately, very few ever ask what God might want. This extends to their own lives and for those under their responsibility. And Matthew's Gospel says some strong things about this issue. Jesus teaches us that we can't ever allow our most powerful human loves keep us from him – or from God's will for us. Consequently, if we love father, mother, son, or daughter more than Jesus – we are not worthy of him. If our life here is based upon material security or personal longevity, then we will, surely, lose our eternal life with God!

Furthermore, if we don't accept the hardships of life - If we don't make the hard sacrifices the Gospel demands - If we don't take up our own cross, everyday - We are not worthy of the love and friendship of Christ! Then, Jesus turns our attention to something we considered at the onset. God and Jesus are wonderfully present in truly good people. Therefore, when we accept these people - When we do something good for them - When we help them in any way - We will be blessed!

We will also be responding, positively, to God – and to Jesus – who sent them into our lives. Moreover, God's blessing for us will be in ways we never thought possible for ourselves! This is exactly what happened in the passage from the Second Book of Kings! Elisha was a prophet for the one, true, Lord God. Both he and his message were well-received in the territory of Shunem.

The woman who offered him such hospitality and a place to stay recognized his goodness and Godliness. This was whenever Elisha visited the locality. Yet, the woman asked for no favors – nor for anything in return. It would seem that Elisha's servant, Gehazi, was more aware of the woman's plight than his master. The woman was childless and longed for a son. So, Elisha spoke for God and prophesied a son would be born to her within a year. Thus, the woman was blessed beyond any expectation because of her selfless generosity!

In his Letter to the Romans, St. Paul reminds us that our baptism does more than deliver us from Original Sin. Our baptism is also into the life, suffering, and death of Jesus Christ. In our times, much of our suffering will be in resisting the ethos of a bankrupt culture. Often this extends to ungodly pressures from family, friends, associates, and even loved ones.

Nevertheless, Brothers and Sisters, if we suffer with Jesus - If we carry our own cross - If we die as true disciples - Then, we will, most assuredly, rise with him to eternal life!

So, let us pray that we are never diverted from this path of Jesus to the Father! Amen.
