From the Pastor

Hello everyone! It was lovely to meet many of you last weekend, if only briefly. I look forward to getting to know you all more personally over the weeks and months ahead. I have been slowly settling into the new place and learning new names and getting used to the new schedule. I am sure there will be a great deal more to learn in these years as a first time Pastor, so please keep me in your prayers!

The Church has recently celebrated two major Solemnities. On June 24th, we celebrated the Nativity of St. John the Baptist. St. John the Baptist is considered the greatest of the prophets because he lived to see the day of the Christ. He himself was able to physically point out “Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world,” whereas all other prophets of the Old Testament saw the day from afar, but never lived to witness it. He is the bridge connecting the Old Testament of prophecy and waiting and the New Testament of fulfillment in Jesus Christ.

June 24th is also my Ordination Anniversary to the Priesthood. I am very grateful for such a prominent Liturgical celebration for my anniversary. I am also mindful of another Saint that is dear to me, St. John Marie Baptist Vianney, a French parish Priest named after John the Baptist. He shared his desire throughout his life to be like the Baptist- to point out to others the Lamb of God, which he was able to do in a supreme way in the celebration of the Eucharist at every Mass. I too share this profound desire for my priesthood; to point out to others the Lamb of God and to live his motto, “He must increase, I must decrease.” They are words I repeat to myself quietly at every Mass.

On June 29th, the Church also celebrated the Solemnity of Saints Peter and Paul. Mindful that the Church is founded on the rock solid confession of faith of our first Pope, St. Peter, this Good News, this Gospel, is meant to be proclaimed to the ends of the earth, of which St. Paul is the outstanding preacher. The preface of the day stated, “Each in a different way they gathered together the one family of Christ; and revered together throughout the world, they share one martyr’s crown.”

We turn with grateful hearts to these great Saints who give us holy example and we continue to call upon their intercession that we all may lead others to Christ by pointing him out to others, by standing upon the rock foundation of faith in Christ, that we may proclaim the Gospel to all peoples.
