From the Pastor

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Monday July 6th the Church celebrated the feast day of St. Maria Goretti, a Saint whom I have particular devotion toward and a very powerful Saint for our times. Maria was born in 1890 in Italy where she lived in deep poverty. Her father died and Maria's mother and older siblings were forced to labor in the fields while young Maria assumed great responsibilities in their small home. The family was deeply religious and young Maria had a profound piety and devotion to the faith even from a young age.

Alessandro Serenelli, an 18-year-old farm hand who shared the home with the Goretti family, sought to take advantage of Maria, just 12 years old. She knew it was a grave sin and she knew it would endanger his soul so she sought to deter him from this action. Enraged, Alessandro stabbed her 14 times before he fled. She was taken to a hospital where she was operated on, but she died from her wounds a day later on July 6th, 1902.

Before Maria died, she forgave Alessandro and said she wished to see him in heaven with her someday. Alessandro was sentenced to 30 years in prison where he remained bitter, angry and unrepentant for many years, until he had a dream or vision of Maria who handed him 14 lilies, offering him forgiveness. He had a profound change of heart, confessed his sins and began to live for Christ. He was released from prison many years later and went to Maria's mother, begging her for forgiveness, which she did as she exclaimed, "If my daughter can forgive him, who am I to withhold forgiveness."

Maria Goretti was canonized a Saint in 1950 at St. Peter's Basilica in Rome as the Church recognized her holiness, piety, and extraordinary virtue. Her canonization was the largest the Church has ever seen with more than 250,000 people present. At her canonization her siblings, mother and her attacker sat next to one another. Alessandro lived out the rest of his life in penance and prayer as a lay Franciscan brother.

St. Maria Goretti is a great modern Saint for our times as she is the patron saint of youth, young women and purity in an age and culture where purity and chastity is constantly threatened in so many forms. She also is an extraordinary witness to the power of forgiveness and mercy. Saint Maria Goretti, pray for us!
