Marriage - Instruction must begin at least six months in advance. Please contact Fr. Michael to begin the preparation process. An Engaged Encounter or similar course is also required.

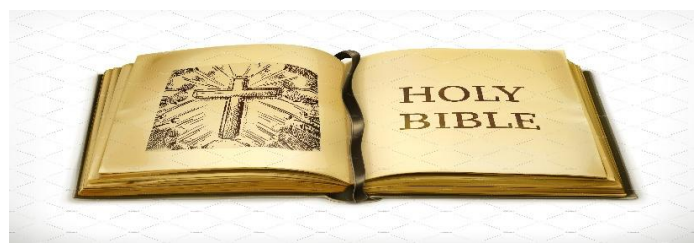
Anointing of the Sick: The sacrament is available before or after Mass on request or arrangements can be made with Fr. Michael for Hospital or Home Visits.

FROM OUR PASTOR

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On Monday this past week we had a clergy golf outing in Rochester hosted by the Rochester Serra club (They pray for priests and vocations). Let's just say it wasn't too pretty, but it was a fun day away with my brother priests.

On Tuesday morning I was able to go to the funeral Mass for Fr. Jim Hennessy in Winona. There were numerous other priests from our Diocese in attendance. I have made a personal commitment in my priesthood to attend all priest funerals that I am able. I have missed a few due to conflicts, but I have made it to most of our priests' funerals since I was ordained. Even though I never knew Fr. Jim, I am grateful for his priesthood and how he faithfully served the people of our Diocese for so many years.

With that in mind, I am also extremely grateful to Fr. Chinnappa who faithfully served these parishes for the past 4-10 years. Some of you have shared how you got to know him and really loved him and some of you have also shared the legitimate challenges of having a hard time understanding him. Due to the fewer number of our priests we have had to bring in multiple priests from foreign countries. Without them, there would be a number of parishes in our Diocese that would not have Mass or the Sacraments. They have sacrificed a great deal to travel across the world to minister to us in our need. Recognizing the legitimate challenges, I hope that your hearts too remain in gratitude for the many ways he served you. Please pray for him as he adjusts back to life in India.

On Tuesday evening, a few of us priests attended one of the Beethoven concerts in Winona for the Beethoven Festival. I am not at all musically gifted or talented and there is much I do not know about music, but it was very lovely and beautiful. The 30 year old pianist was extremely gifted and it was an enjoyable evening with brother priests.

I mention all of this because at the end of priest funerals, all of us priests present gather around the casket and sing the Salve Regina (Hail Holy Queen in Latin as we commend our brother to the care and prayers of the Blessed Virgin Mary) and we sing a short hymn we learned at IHM Seminary "*Ecce quam bonum et quam iucundum habitare fratres, fratres in unum*" which is Latin for "Behold how good and how splendid it is where brothers dwell as one. (Psalm 133:1)" As usual, I was very moved by this at Fr. Jim's funeral as he was a brother in Christ and a brother in the Priesthood. It made me very grateful in prayer this week for the gift of my Priesthood and for the gift of my brother priests with whom I share this amazing gift.

Know of my prayers for you. Please pray for me.
