Marriage - Instruction must begin at least six months in advance. Please contact Fr. Michael to begin the preparation process. An Engaged Encounter or similar course is also required.

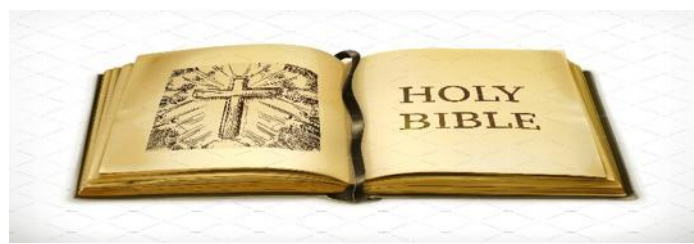
Anointing of the Sick: The sacrament is available before or after Mass on request or arrangements can be made with Fr. Michael for Hospital or Home Visits.

From our Pastor

Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Over the next two weeks, our Diocese is running a summer camp called Camp Summit at Eagle Bluff Environmental Learning Center in Lanesboro. Campers are officially 6th through 8th graders, but there is also a prayer team who are typically 9th-10th graders, and there is a student leadership team typically 10th-12th grade. It is a very well run summer camp with activities like rock wall, high ropes course, archery and numerous other activities run by Eagle Bluff staff. In addition to that, there are fun diocesan activities, talks, and ample opportunities for prayer including adoration, confession, and daily Mass.

I will be helping out here and there throughout the next two weeks with Masses and confessions and spending some time with the young people at camp, many of whom I have gotten to know pretty well through previous assignments and through helping at Camp Summit in the past. I believe there are at least a few who are going from our parish cluster as well, so please pray for these young people that they may encounter the Lord in a profound way and that they have open hearts to truly embrace the love that God has for them and that they may in return love the Lord wholeheartedly.

Camp Summit is named as such after a quote from the Second Vatican Council document called *Lumen Gentium* (Light to the Nations), which describes the Eucharist/the Mass as “the source and summit of the Christian life.” The Eucharist, which is truly the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Jesus Christ, is the source, because the Eucharist enables us to make present and offer anew Jesus Christ’s one redemptive Sacrifice of Cavalry. The Eucharist is the source, the beginning as all grace and mercy flow from this gift of God as he pours himself out in love for our salvation.

The Eucharist is also the summit of our Christian life because the Eucharist is truly a foretaste of heaven. In our Christian life and spirituality, the Eucharist is both our starting point and our end goal, the heights to which we seek to attain which is union with God. As Christ offered himself totally and completely in obedience to the Father and for our salvation, we too are to give of ourselves and pour ourselves out in love, uniting ourselves to the Lord.
