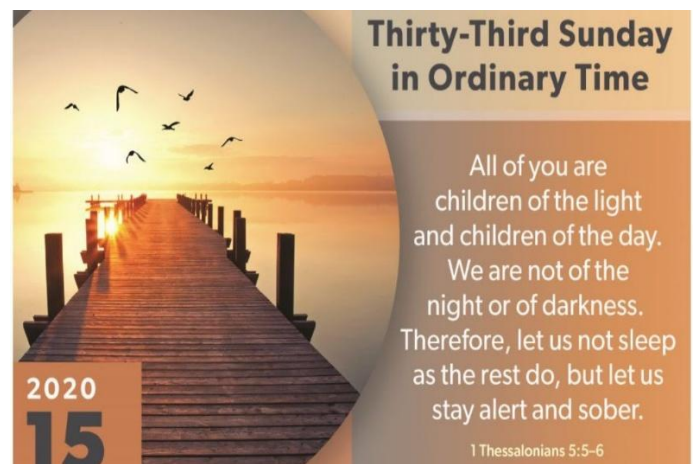

"The Fire and Love of God"

People have always wondered about the end of the world. In every age, there are those who are certain that the Earth will be destroyed in their lifetime. Nevertheless, our world continues to exist. Our planet can still support life. Faith-filled Christians know that life will go on – despite their own death – or the death of our planet.

Authentic Christians know that they were made for more than this world or this life. They have an immortal, spiritual component which will live forever!

800 years before Jesus, the Prophet Malachi revealed that the end of the world will be a fiery one. All evil-doers will be punished by a searing inferno. But the just – those who have been faithful to God – will be healed by the fire of God's love!

At the time of Jesus, the Hebrew people treasured the Temple of Jerusalem. It was a sign of God's commitment to them. However, Jesus told them that it would be destroyed. When they asked for a sign and some proof – Jesus answered ambiguously. But what he said then, continues to be true today. Jerusalem and the Temple were destroyed during the lifetime of many of his listeners. However, Jesus was speaking of the end of the world as well!

Historically, there have been uprisings and wars in almost every generation since the time of Jesus. Nations continue to be hostile to other nations – politically, economically, and militarily! In fact, there are many countries with enough nuclear weapons to destroy every living creature across our globe! There have been earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, famines, and plagues up to the present day. There are also those who claim to be new saviors or the Messiah himself!

These modern saviors falsely believe that they have all the answers and solutions that everyone needs. They claim:– that there is no God — that life here is all that there is — that each person should serve themselves — that no pleasure should be denied to anyone — that we are free to mutilate our bodies with sex-changing operations or hormones — that unborn, partially born, and newly born children can be murdered – and be disposed of as surgical garbage!

In his 2nd Letter to the Thessalonians, St. Paul reminds us how important it is to care for the common good in every age. Everyone must make some contribution toward the good of others. There can be no freeloaders! In our time, welfare programs have been abused by many who are lazy, indolent, and selfish. Paul told the early Christians that anyone who didn't work, shouldn't eat! He also condemned busy-bodies. These were like those who spread all kinds of gossip – and lies – on the Internet today!

Brothers and Sisters: if we follow Jesus – if we live by his Gospel — if we listen to the Holy Spirit – we will suffer. We will suffer disfavor – the loss of some friends – and even be persecuted in some form. This has happened in every age – It continues to happen today. Some have even been killed – here and abroad – because they would not compromise God's Truth in any way.

So let us pray for steadfastness – no matter what happens – now or in the future – May we always be ready to meet Jesus at our own death whenever that might be – For Jesus will bring the healing love of God's Fire! Amen.
