“Faith and Relationships”

One of the challenges that everyone has to face is that of understanding people. Everyone is different – Everyone is unique – And to understand anyone will take time, effort, and commitment. Sometimes we “write-off” people because they seem very different than we are. Or, we can completely discount what they say – because we don’t understand the subject matter – or don’t agree with them. However, in every case we might be doing ourselves a disservice – Possibly, we missed an opportunity to learn, to grow – and to become a much deeper person ourself.

To know someone, requires that we enter into a relationship with them. This means dropping some of our defenses. It means taking on the possibility of friendship. And real friendship can be hard because often it involves suffering! Everything we have considered thus far also applies to God. Because God is a mystery – For the most part, God completely transcends our poor power to comprehend or understand.

Nevertheless, God wants to be our friend. God created us out of love. And God wants to share His love for us. In doing so, God risks revealing something of the Godhead. It is that God is a Trinity. God is a Father - Creator – God is a Son who is Word and Wisdom – God is a Loving, Sanctifying Spirit. Each of these unfathomable entities is a person. Each of these persons, though distinct, are one and the same Godhead. Moreover, what is tragic is that we can reject this and not believe at all!

The Book of Proverbs reveals that Divine Wisdom – who is the Word – who is the Son – existed before time began. He pre-existed all of material and spiritual creation. And that person who is Eternal Wisdom rejoiced when the human race was created. He found delight-- perhaps because he would, one day, take on a human body and soul in Jesus of Nazareth!

In the Gospel of John, Jesus reveals that the Holy Spirit will come only after his departure. That Spirit can dwell within us. It makes more understandable all that Jesus taught. It can also fill us with the love of God which is the very relationship of love in the Divine Self – Because the Spirit is the Love between the Father and the Son!

In the Letter to the Romans, St. Paul speaks about the necessary relationship that faith requires. Moreover, if we have a real relationship with God, we have peace with God. It is Jesus, the Divine Word, who has garnered this peace for us. And because of our salvation in the Son, we can boast of the eternal glory that we will share with him.

Paul tells us that we can even boast about our afflictions – about the cross we carry with Christ. Because of our relationship in suffering, we grow in endurance – Our endurance proves the character of our soul. Our character in Christ brings forth hope – And our hope will never disappoint us – Because God will pour His own Life and Love into our hearts who is the Loving Spirit, the Holy Spirit!

Brothers and Sisters, in a world of pseudo – and superficial – relationships, we are blessed with a true and real one. With faith, we possess an authentic relationship with God. It is with the Father-Creator, the Wisdom-Word-Son, and the Loving Holy Spirit. Because of our relationship with this wonderful Trinity, we can risk more in our relationships with other people. We can risk more of our personal self-revelation, because God is always there. The Father has created us in Love for Himself – The Son has saved us from sin – The Holy Spirit guides our every moment!

So let us pray that we grow closer to God every day of our life. And may our relationship of faith sustain us with every person we encounter! Amen.
