# "Real Humility"

We live in an age and culture wherein many people want to stand out. All we have to do is look celebrities \_ especially the entertainment industry to verify this observation. What is sad, is that so many others try to imitate them. Both men and women succumb to this. They do this with wardrobe styles - with personal makeovers - and with personal status and power. They also deny - or try to cover up - their personal flaws and serious mistakes. Furthermore, they want to be respected - and to be given special treatment wherever they go.

What most celebrities lack – and what those who imitate them also lack – is humility – Because humility is characterized by many different – but wonderful – attributes. The basic meaning of humility is that it is truth about ourself. It is the honest admission of who we are – to ourselves. This includes our personal assets and liabilities – our strengths and our weaknesses – our abilities and our shortcomings – our goodness and our sinfulness.

Real humility means that we truly see ourselves – body and soul – as we stand before God. Both the Book of Sirach and the Gospel of Luke have much to teach us about humility in the passages for today.

The Prophet Sirach tells us that if we do everything with real honesty and integrity – with humility – we will be loved and esteemed more than a giver of gifts! The reason for this is that we will be gifting others with non-material gifts. We will be blessing them with a wonderful graciousness – with courtesy, with thoughtfulness, consideration, and with good manners. And the more we do this – despite any personal status, power, or position – the more do we bring God's favor upon ourselves!

Furthermore, the humble person doesn't seek or aspire to things beyond their inherent talents or abilities. They also have an open mind. They listen for the wisdom they can garner from others – And they understand that sharing their material wealth with the truly poor – atones for

their sins. In some mysterious way it makes up for some of their sinfulness in the eyes of God.

In the passage from St. Luke, Jesus tells us to always defer to others. Pushing ourselves into a prominent position is always precarious – Because we run the risk of being humiliated. Humiliation is defined as being publicly shamed. It is being made to look foolish, with a loss of dignity and self-respect!

What Jesus has to say about inviting others to dinner is problematic in many of our cities these days. Certainly, the poor, the crippled, the lame, and the blind always need our help. However, to invite anyone unknown to a dinner can be a very dangerous thing. But that does not excuse us from donating generously to the Good News Rescue Mission – to One Safe Place – to Loaves and Fishes – or to the Knights of Columbus. All of these have outreach programs. They truly benefit so many who are poor and deprived in so many different ways!

Brothers and Sisters, growth in humility is a lifelong process. We must overcome so much in ourselves that feeds our ego. Our bankrupt culture idolizes and champions the successful, the wealthy, the powerful. It looks upon everyone less, unfavorably – even with disdain.

But God sees all things – God knows all things – God knows the real truth about ourselves. And God knows when we defer to others – when we serve them graciously — when we make time to listen to them — when we really don't mind if we are passed over or left out. God always has us – God loves each of us – And it would seem that God loves the least of us most of all!

So let us thank God for whatever He has given us – Let us pray that we, each, become more humble – May we truly grow more truthful and honest with ourselves – and about ourselves – every day! Amen.
