

## "Material or Spiritual?"

Most people everywhere would like for life to be as easy as possible. Most people would like to work less – and still have a large income. We, likewise, have hopes and plans for the future. That future would be work-free, with financial independence.

Consequently, many would like to see into the future. They would like to know beforehand all that will take place in their lives. This would enable them, now, to make decisions that would result in favorable outcomes. However, life is never this way – And the scriptures for today have much to teach us about our plans – and God's plans for us as well.

The Book of Wisdom reveals that we simply cannot know the mind of God. It reminds us that we are body and soul. We are material and spiritual in our makeup. Our minds seek the answers for so many different things. Science has explained many, formerly unknown, mysteries. Yet, science is useless confronting the truly spiritual. It cannot know the mind or the plan of God. Nevertheless, God does reach out on our journey here to Him. He will send His Holy Spirit to guide us on a straight path. But we must be believers and receptive to His overtures.

In the Gospel of St. Luke, Jesus tells us that there is no easy way into the Kingdom of Heaven. God's kingdom of eternal glory cannot be attained without great struggle and hard work. If we would follow Jesus, we must be prepared and willing to give up everything in our life here. The "hate" of which Jesus speaks, is not rancor, ill-will, or animosity. It is not the

hatred that leads to physical violence or revenge. It is not the hatred that seeks to destroy! No! What Jesus means is that we cannot ever allow family – or loved ones – to get in the way of following him and his Gospel. Because to do so, disqualifies us for true discipleship!

Jesus also tells us that we must expect to suffer. We must take up our own cross to follow him. We cannot expect anyone else to do it for us. And much of our cross will be dealing with the uncertainty, the misfortune, and the tragedy that befalls everyone. Furthermore, Jesus urges us to take very seriously all that God might, possibly, ask of us.

The king should negotiate rather than lose everything against overwhelming forces. The contractor must be certain that he has everything necessary to complete the project. And we must be willing to part with anything and everything – if that is what God asks of us. This might be one thing after another until we are finally attached to nothing when God comes for us at death!

St. Paul had made every sacrifice that God asked of him. He was an old man – He had suffered much – He was under house arrest – and awaiting execution in Rome. Onesimus was a runaway slave. He had caused his owner and master serious harm in some way. He sought out St. Paul and became a new Christian through Paul. Then, St. Paul persuaded him to return to his master, Philemon, with Paul's letter.

Thus, St. Paul pleaded with Philemon to set Onesimus free and not condemn him to death. He hoped that Philemon would realize something very important. It was that Onesimus was one of God's children. He was a fellow believer in Jesus and his Gospel. Paul hoped that both men would sacrifice what they had formerly possessed. For Philemon it was the mastery over a slave's life and death. For Onesimus it was freedom and his life in this world. Both should be willing to give up something of our material world – for the truly spiritual in God!

Brothers and Sisters, there is no easy way into the Kingdom that Jesus has promised. Each day, God will ask something of us. Each day, the Gospel of Jesus will challenge us. Each day, the Holy Spirit will be there to guide us.

So, let us pray, that we never let anything here get in the way of who we must become for God and His Kingdom! Amen.
