Pope's Intention for June

Grow in Humanity and Compassion.

Let us pray that we can grow in humanity, so that our relationships may be truer and richer in compassion. Let us ask the Heart of Jesus for the grace increasingly to have the same feelings as him.



“The Spirit of God’s Love”

How do we survive in a world in which we seem powerless to change? How do we keep our value system when so many others have lost theirs? Our culture has become bankrupt. And our society is largely controlled by the big money of the nameless oligarchs!

The only answer is to have a spiritual life. We must remember that we are body and soul. We have a physical, material side. That side wants to live as long as possible. It also wants to enjoy every possible physical pleasure. In contrast our spiritual side longs for the infinite. It seeks interior freedom, deep peace, and limitless love!

Fortunately, all the scriptures for today provide insight – and direction – for our lives. The Apostles felt powerless after Jesus left them. Jesus had commissioned them with the mission of changing the world. But they were unable to escape their fears. And then, suddenly, the world opened up before them. The promised Holy Spirit became the Advocate of Jesus. Their fears evaporated – Their hesitancy disappeared – Their spirits were energized – All by divine power and divine love! They were enabled to go forth and proclaim the Good News, the Gospel of Jesus, to the world!

St. Paul became a special Apostle only after a dramatic encounter with the Risen Christ. He doesn’t mince his words in his Letter to the Romans. He tells us that if we live in the flesh – If we are focused on material things – If our life is money, power, possessions, or erotic desires – We cannot please God – And we are dead!

Nevertheless, if we live by the Spirit of Christ – If we live by goodness and what is right – If we seek God’s ways and truth through Christ – Then, we are alive! Our body will die because of Original Sin and our own sins – But our soul will survive and live forever – if we live godly lives! St. Paul also tells us that if we are led by the Holy Spirit, we are children of God. We are not slaves to the “lusts of the flesh, the lusts of the eyes, and the pride of life”! No! We are free children – And we are heirs to all that Jesus has promised.

There is only one other condition. If we would be heirs of the Kingdom of Christ – We must also be willing to suffer and die with him in some way. We must accept the cross, however it comes – But our glorification with Jesus will be the result! On the night before he died, Jesus had much to share with his friends. He gave them intimacy with himself in the Eucharist. The Bread and the Wine were his body and his blood. That body

would be broken – and that blood poured out – the next day!

However, Jesus also said that the ultimate proof of their love would be that they kept his word. This included his commandments. And the greatest commandment of Jesus was to love. It was to love others as he continues to love us!

Brothers and Sisters, the Holy Spirit is divine love in itself. Theologians have said that the Holy Spirit is the Love of the Father for the Son and the Love of the Son for the Father. Thus, the Holy Spirit is Divine Love personified! The Holy Spirit is the new power that the Father and the Son have unleashed upon the world. That power might be resisted by the forces of evil – But it can never be overcome!

Furthermore, that Spirit can empower us to be steadfast and faithful. It can enable us to influence the world of those around us. Ultimately, it can enable us to survive here until the day we are called home to be with Jesus and God!

So let us pray that the Holy Spirit of God continues to guide and enlighten every step we take while we are here! Amen.
