Sample Huddle Lesson

Raise your hand if you saw any games or highlights from the FIFA World Cup 2026. The final between Spain and Argentina was viewed by 66 million Americans—making it the most watched soccer match in US television history. After every game that TEAM USA played, the team circled up and was led in prayer by a player named Mark McKenzie. Take a look at the 5 minute interview that he gave.

(Watch video from 45 second mark to the end @ 6:09)

- 1) Mark McKenzie has experienced a good bit of success in soccer nationally and internationally. What is something that you've had some success in? (This could be a specific sport, hobby, academics...) The person leading this lesson shares your answer and then the shortest person in each huddle goes first.
- 2) Not sure if you picked up on it, but Mark did NOT talk much about “success.” He kept mentioning two other S words—Surrender and Sacrifice! The night before Jesus went to the cross he prayed a hard prayer. **Read Luke 22:41-42.** We might not have to surrender our physical life on a cross but as a follower of Christ what is something that you have surrendered or may have to “surrender?” Person leading goes first and then tallest person starts sharing in huddles.
- 3) In the video Mark said as part of the national team, “I’m not just representing USA, I’m representing Jesus as my Lord and Savior.” 2 Corinthians 5:20 says. “We are therefore Christ’s ambassadors.” (Some translations say Christ’s “representatives”) Who is someone you know that “represents” Jesus well? Give an example of how. (Person leading lesson give your answer and then person with longest hair starts.)
- 4) I love the part at the end where Mark bread down and says, “that love that God has for me is what spurs me on each and every day.” 2 Corinthians 5:14 says, “For Christ’s love compels us.” We’re not spurred on by fear, or by rewards, or expectations, we’re spurred on by CHRIST’S LOVE for us. That’s the reason this athlete spoke up and invites his teammates to pray. Person leading the lesson share a specific story of when Christ’s love compelled you to do or say something (maybe stopping for a homeless person, asking someone to forgive you, speaking up, obeying God in some way...)
- 5) **Have everyone make one big circle and close in prayer.**

FCA Interview Questions

- Tell us a little about life growing up...your family, sports you played, interests...
- Give us 2 or 3 athletic accomplishments.
- Give us 2 strengths, 2 weaknesses.
- Who is Jesus to you?
- How did you come into a relationship with Him?
- Give us a couple of things that God has taught you recently (open your Bible & take them to a passage or two).
- Do you ever get nervous? How do you deal with it?
- Share with us a couple of embarrassing moments.
- How has your involvement in sports opened doors for you to share your faith? Give us a couple of real life examples.
- Who have been role models for you? In what way?
- Any goals or dreams you are chasing?
- Do you have a life verse or a verse you quote to yourself frequently?
- Any advice for this group from someone who is not that much older than they are?

FCA's Christian Beliefs

4.1 FCA Statement of Faith

- We believe the Bible to be the only inspired, trustworthy and true, without error, Word of God. (2 Timothy 3:16-17)
- We believe there is only one God who eternally exists in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (Matthew 28:19)
- We believe Jesus Christ is God, in His virgin birth, in His sinless life, in His miracles, in His death that paid for our sin through His shed blood, in His bodily resurrection, in His ascension/rising up to the right hand of the Father, and in His personal return in power and glory. (John 1:1; Matthew 1:18,25; Hebrews 4:15; Hebrews 9:15-22; 1 Corinthians 15:1-8; Acts 1:9-11; Hebrews 9:27-28)
- We believe that acceptance of Jesus Christ and the corresponding renewal of the Holy Spirit is the only path to salvation for lost/sinful men and women. (John 3:16; John 5:24; Titus 3:3-7)
- We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit, who lives within and guides Christians, so they are enabled to live godly lives. (John 14:15-26; John 16:5-16; Ephesians 1:13-14)
- We believe in eternal life and that through belief in Jesus Christ as the Son of God, we spend eternity with the Lord in Heaven. We believe that in rejecting Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior, we receive eternal suffering in hell. (Matthew 25:31-46; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18)
- We believe in the spiritual unity of believers in our Lord Jesus Christ that all believers are members of His body, the church. (Philippians 2:1-4)

4.2 Biblical Standards for Our Community

In response to current cultural trends, the following more specifically articulates our Christian Beliefs and associated community standards on the following subjects.

4.2.1.1 Gender

We believe that God creates people in His image as two distinct genders, male and female, and that the intended gender of an individual is determined by such individual's biological sex at birth (Genesis 1:27; Matthew 19:4; Mark 10:6).

4.2.1.2 Sexuality

Scripture is clear in that Christians are to find their identity in Christ. We find complete and appropriate expression of who we are, including sexuality, when our actions align with God's design for sexual identity and expression.

The Bible also states in several passages that participating in sex outside of Biblical Marriage, including sexual idolatry, lust, pornography, is outside of God's will for a Christian (1 Corinthians 6:9-11, 18-20). Because of the Bible's clear stance on this subject, FCA does not condone any sexually immoral act outlined in the Bible.

4.2.1.3 Biblical Marriage

We believe God has instituted marriage as a lifelong covenant relationship between a man and a woman and calls spouses to exclusive sexual fidelity. In our policies and programs we will recognize only marriage between one man and one woman ("Biblical Marriage") as consistent with our Christian Beliefs. Any events in FCA facilities pertaining to marriage (e.g., weddings, receptions, anniversary celebrations) must involve only marriages consistent with our Christian Beliefs. (Genesis 2:18-25)

4.2.1.4 Sex

We believe that sexual relations outside of Biblical Marriage (defined above) (whether involving individuals of the same or opposite sex) are inconsistent with God's call to holiness in our lives. This includes unmarried singles to abstain from sexual relations. We further believe that pornographic materials undermine the dignity and image of God in individuals and promotes sexual conduct contrary to our Christian Beliefs. (1 Corinthians 6:12-20; Ephesians 5:3; Hebrews 13:4)

Our beliefs regarding gender, human sexuality, marriage and sex shall apply in all policies and programs in the FCA Christian community.

4.2.2 Sanctity of Life

We believe individuals are created by God in His image commencing at conception/fertilization. We accordingly believe as a matter of Christian conviction that no procedures should be performed for the primary purpose of terminating a pregnancy and taking the life of an unborn, except in extraordinary circumstances where other biblical, moral principles prevail, such as where it is medically necessary to preserve the life of the mother. Our beliefs also prohibit paying for or otherwise facilitating such procedures.

As dictated by these beliefs, we will not as an institution fund abortions in any manner, including through a health care FCA benefit plan that covers drugs used to induce

abortions, except in the foregoing extraordinary circumstances: (i) any such drug is prescribed and used solely for a non-abortive therapeutic treatment of a covered medical condition or for an abortion in the foregoing extraordinary circumstances.

Any requirement to facilitate abortions by offering such coverage or participating in such a program, and any penalty for failing to offer such coverage or participate in such a program, would directly and substantially burden and undermine our exercise and expression of our Christian Beliefs.

(Genesis 1:27; Psalm 139:13-16; Ephesians 1:3-4)

4.2.3 Diversity

We believe all men and women are created in God's image and are of equal value and great worth to Him. Therefore, FCA will strive to reflect the body of Christ throughout our ministry (Matthew 22:37-39; Galatians 3:27-28; Revelation 7:9-10).

We further believe that all prejudice, bias and racism is wrong and is rooted in sin. We believe that as disciples of Jesus Christ, it's our responsibility to follow His example and instruction to love one another. Jesus said the two greatest commandments are to love God "with all your heart, all your soul, and all your mind." The second is to "love your neighbor as yourself" (Matthew 22:37-38).

4.3 Social Media, Political Activity and Other Public Statements

We desire to represent the same Christian beliefs and standards to the online world as we do in person. Therefore, in any public forum, including social media, we expect leaders to respect our Christian Beliefs and not to challenge, disparage or undermine them. If a leader chooses to express their disagreement with a particular belief that they are not required to affirm, we expect such leader to do so in a manner that respects our beliefs and makes it clear they are not expressing the view of FCA (Colossians 4:6; Proverbs 16:23, Ephesians 4:29).

4.4 Controlled Substances, Alcohol, Tobacco and Cannabis

We believe that the misuse of controlled substances, alcohol, tobacco and cannabis undermines the role of the Holy Spirit in forming the minds and hearts of individuals (Proverbs 23:19-21). Scripture also prohibits drunkenness and warns about the dangers of drinking (Ephesians 5:18; 1 Corinthians 6:19-20). Therefore, all leaders shall not use such products [except for medical reasons directed by a licensed medical doctor (M.D.)] while conducting the activities of FCA, and no such products may be used in any of our facilities and/or any facility in which FCA is conducting activity.
