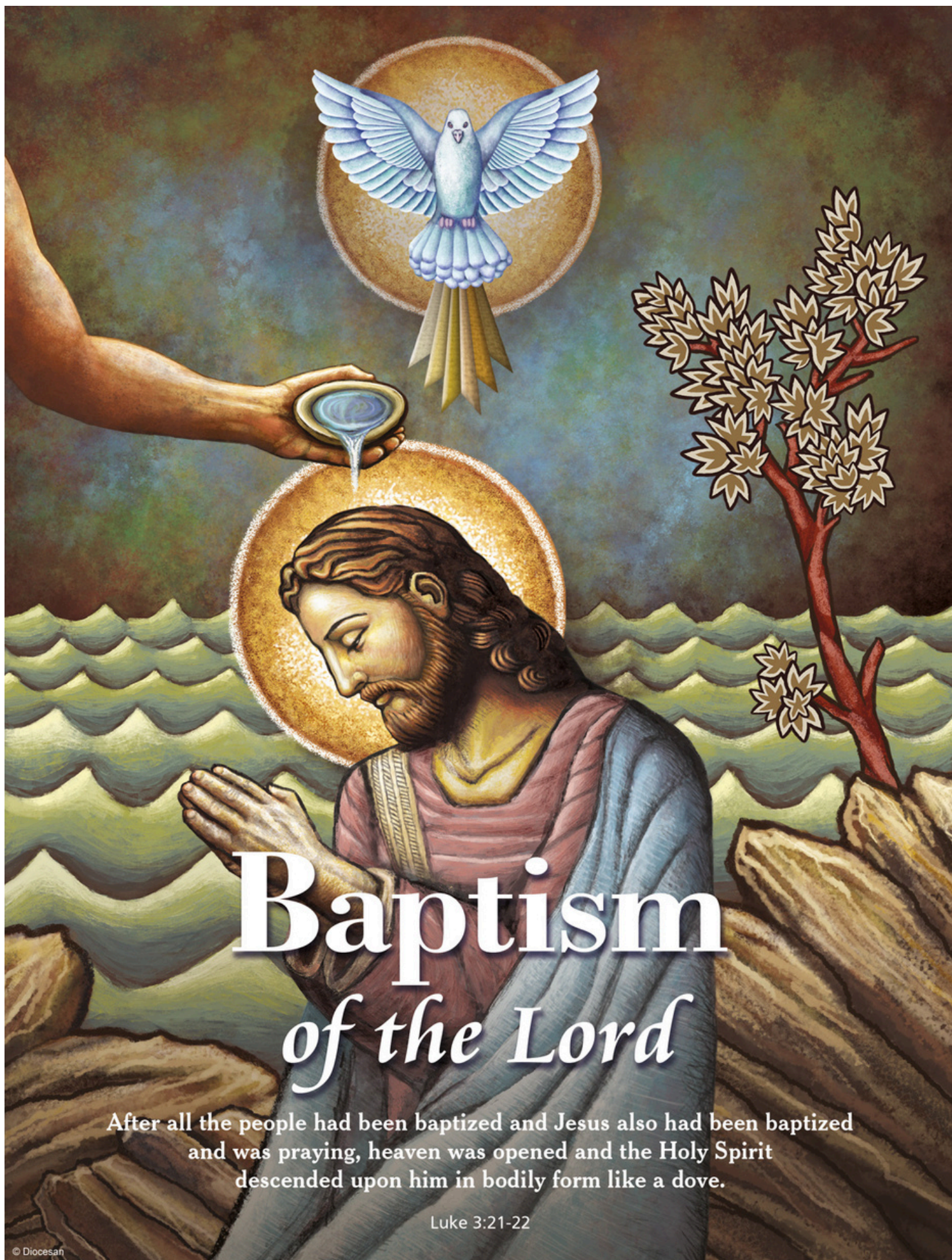

Dear Parishioners,

The celebration of the baptism of Jesus, while relatively simple on the surface, is rich with theological meaning. From Old Testament times, believers in God have been peeling back layers of meaning regarding God's love for water and his penchant for tying a water-event to his greatest divine works. Let's sketch a brief overview of divine "water events" from the Old Testament. At the dawn of time, God's Spirit hovered over the waters. Water was the foundation of creation. Noah built the ark to save his family from the great flood that purified the earth. Moses led the people of Israel through the Red Sea to the Promised Land. The first Christians knew these stories well; they were foundational events for the Jewish faith.

We can picture for a moment the experience of Paul and the first Jewish converts. As Jesus ascends to heaven, his last commandment is that they go and baptize the nations with water (see Matthew 28:19).

As they began to do this, a wave of understanding poured over them like never before! They noticed for the first time that Christian baptism gave a new meaning to the Old Testament stories of creation, the flood, and the Red Sea. In the light of the Resurrected Christ, they were seeing more clearly. The first Christians realized that what God had done with water in the Old Testament was now being continued in the Christian era through water-baptism.

The creation of the world upon the waters, the flood in the time of Noah, and the crossing of the Red Sea in the time of Moses now were much more than just awesome works of power by the Lord God as he saved his people. They were actually only incomplete foreshadowings of an even greater divine power found now in Baptism. These first Christians then recognized just how blessed they were. Unlike their forefathers, Adam, Noah, and Moses, they had met the long-awaited Messiah. They were blessed to be the ones who saw him with their own eyes, heard him with their own ears, touched him with their hands, and even tasted him in the Eucharist. They knew their forefathers had longed with the love beyond all telling for the Messiah, and yet they were the ones, through no merit on their part, to have been graced with the Messiah. If Adam could have chosen between witnessing God's first creation "over the face of the waters" in Genesis or witnessing the new creation of the world in Christ, he would have chosen the Christ.

If Noah could have chosen between witnessing the flood waters of his day or the flood waters from the heart of Christ on the Cross, he would have chosen the Cross. If Moses could have witnessed the destruction of the Egyptian army in the Red Sea or the destruction of Satan by the death of Jesus, he would have chosen the death of Jesus. What Adam, Noah, and Moses had experienced in the salvific actions of God all paled in comparison to what Jesus has done through his Paschal Mystery. These Old Testament figures only saw "through a glass, darkly" that in the future God would perform for their benefit deeds analogous to and even greater than those he had performed in their own times. Today, we are equally blessed as were those first Christians.

For the action and work of Christ is ongoing through the sacraments today. Do you wish to witness the great flood, or the crossing of the Red Sea, or perhaps to see God work a splendid new creation? Since the mysteries of the work of Christ are still happening now through the work of the Church, you certainly can! This isn't mere poetic exaggeration; this isn't mere metaphoric pondering. At the waters of a Christian Baptism, a greater flood, a greater destruction of evil, and a new and greater creation take place!

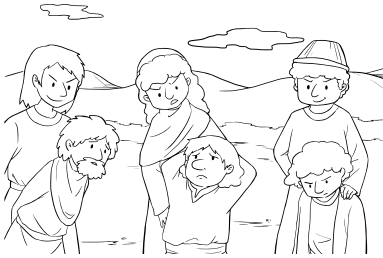
TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Through the centuries, artists and craftspeople have depicted Jesus' baptism in the Jordan River by John. At first in mosaics and frescoes, and later in tapestries, stained glass, and paintings, the scene is familiar. Jesus is standing waist-high in flowing water. Above him, standing on dry land, John the Baptist pours water over Jesus. The first artists to depict this were sketching from memory. This is exactly how most people were baptized in the early days: as adults, standing or kneeling in the water, with water poured over their heads.

This method of baptizing, called immersion, is the favored way today. An adult enters a font, or an infant is lowered a bit into the water supported by a parent's hand, and water is poured or splashed over them. The treasures of baptistry art attest that submersion, or plunging beneath the water's surface, is not really in our tradition, and that "infusion," the mere pouring of a few drops of water, yields too narrow an understanding of what it means to be plunged into

Christ's life. Jesus Christ has gone before us into the water, and waits for us there with abundant gifts. No wonder the tradition calls for abundant symbols!

The Baptism of the Lord Well Pleased



The first reading from Isaiah begins by describing the servant "with whom I am well pleased" (Isaiah 42:1). These are the words of the voice from the heavens that was heard at Jesus' baptism. Isaiah gives us more hints about who Jesus is.

The verses that say that he will not break the bruised reed or quench the smoldering wick (Isaiah 42:3) are descriptive of Jesus' mercy toward sinners. The reed and the wick were disposed of because they were useless. But God, out of love for us, is always ready to forgive sinners and give them another chance. So God sent Jesus to forgive sinners, not reject them. We can ask God to help us see our sinfulness and bring it to God for healing.

Isaiah also says that the servant is a "covenant of the people." A covenant was an agreement between unequal partners, in which the stronger one agrees to protect or defend the weaker one. God is offering a new covenant through Jesus, not just for the Jews, but for all peoples. In this covenant, God has forgiven our sins before we were even born, much less committed any sins. But we still have to live that covenant, by loving God and our neighbor. When we forgive each other, we are setting free prisoners of sin. When people see God's love acted out in our lives, we are a light to the world. As we learn to do these things, we will find that God is well pleased with us.

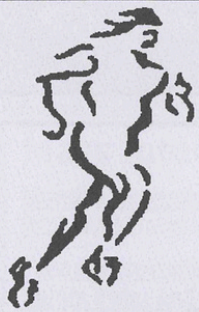
