

NOW I HAVE SEEN AND TESTIFIED
THAT HE IS THE SON OF GOD

Dear Parishioners,

Today, we are entering further into the season of Ordinary Time.

Here, we are invited to ponder the public ministry of Jesus. And a central focus of this period is to get to know Jesus better. As Jesus begins his ministry, he approaches the Jordan River. His kinsman, John the Baptist, is there, baptizing and preaching repentance. And John, on seeing Jesus perhaps for the first time, makes a statement that does not seem to fit in with what would be expected. John claims: "I did not know him."

We know that Mary and Elizabeth (John's mother) were related. Bible translations often say that Mary and Elizabeth are cousins, but this is not clear. Here is some input into it: "The New Testament does not say that Elizabeth is Mary's cousin, the Greek word for which is anepsios. The word used in Luke 1:36 to describe Elizabeth is suggenes, which simply means kinswoman or relative. It tells us nothing about her exact relation within the extended family. All we can tell from the word suggenes is that Elizabeth was some kind of female relative of Mary's. But whether she was an aunt, a cousin, or a more distant relation cannot be determined from the word." So we know that Jesus and John are related. Their mothers were also friends who visited each other and spent periods of time living together (the Visitation).

So, shouldn't John and Jesus have known each other as young boys? How can John say he does not know him? We are reading from John's Gospel about today's event. But if we read Luke's version of today's event, he makes clear that John the Baptist "lived in the wilderness until he appeared publicly to Israel." Perhaps because John was at such a young age living in the wilderness, he never met Jesus by sight.

Somehow, in the desert, John received a message from heaven. It is unclear who or what happened, but John claims that: "The one who sent me to baptize with water told me, 'On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.'" (John 1:33) This means John did not know Jesus by sight. Rather, he knew him by faith. This puts us all in a similar place as John the Baptist.


All of us, in theory, have not seen Jesus by sight. But if we are here today, it is because we know him by faith. John the Baptist stayed faithful to God over the long years of his time in the desert. He stayed faithful to God even when he was confronted by the religious and secular authorities. At some point, Jesus crossed his path, and because John had faith, he knew it was Jesus.

How often in our own lives do we see Jesus cross our path? We find Jesus today in the Gospel, in the Eucharist, and in the Church community. We have many ways of "finding Jesus". Let us make sure that by seeking him in these ways, when Jesus does appear on the horizon, coming to us, that we recognize the presence of Our Lord!







SAINT AGNES (died 304) January 21

Writing about Saint Agnes in the year 377, Saint Ambrose, Bishop of Milan, declared: "This is a virgin's birthday into heaven: let us imitate her chastity! And a martyr's heavenly birthday: let us offer ourselves in sacrifice!" Chastity: mastery of oneself in order to give of oneself whether in the priestly, religious, married, or single state. Sacrifice: "to make holy," to set someone or something apart for service. Ambrose knew these virtues indispensable for discipleship, but challenging to practice in his world—or our own. Barely a teenager, Agnes faced gruesome tortures bravely and, when ordered to worship pagan gods, boldly made the Sign of the Cross instead. Thus, her youthful courage strengthened adult believers who

wavered under persecution or grew indifferent when persecutions passed. To bestow on Agnes its highest honor and keep her witness fresh in believers' hearts, the Church inscribed her name at the heart of the Eucharistic liturgy, in the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer I), until Vatican II the Roman Church's only Eucharistic Prayer.

Second Sunday in Ordinary Time Behold the Lamb of God

I wonder if anyone understood John the Baptist when he called Jesus the Lamb of God. After Jesus' death and resurrection, the apostles began to understand that Jesus' blood, shed on the cross, freed us all from sin and death. Yet here is the Baptizer already acting like a disciple before Jesus has gathered any disciples or even begun to preach. In today's Gospel, John the Baptist gives us some hints about discipleship.

First, John trusts God with things he does not understand. He says twice that he did not know Jesus. We too may not always understand where God is leading us. If you have lost a loved one, are looking for work when no one is hiring, or are dealing with a serious illness, this is the time to trust that God still loves and cares for you.

John also knew that doing God's work meant that God was working through him. Originally, John baptized others as a sign of repentance, but he soon came to see that his real work was to make Jesus "known to Israel" (John 1:31). When we try to do what God wants, it is good to remember that God is the one in control and who decides what the result will be.

John's third hint teaches us that a disciple shares his or her faith in God. So John testifies that Jesus is the Son of God. Even today, when Jesus is known throughout the world, we still need to share our faith experiences so those without faith may be attracted to it, and even those with faith can be encouraged by our sharing. You may be surprised to find that your own faith deepens the more you share it with others.






