Dear Parishioners,

At the beginning of his ministry, Jesus lays out some of his principal teachings.

Today, he gives us the Beatitudes. And as usual, Jesus turns things upside down and says some very unexpected things! Jesus went up a mountain to teach his followers. He seemed to love mountains. For example, his very hometown, Nazareth, sits perched high up on the limestone hills of Lower Galilee, affording wonderful views of the Jezreel Valley. We can notice in the Gospels that certain places in the Holy Land seemed to attract Jesus more than others. One place that clearly pulled on his heart is the Sea of Galilee. The beautiful blue water presents a clean and refreshing backdrop to the Gospels.

In the Holy Land, the Sea of Galilee is practically untouched by modern-day growth. It appears today very much as it did in the time of Jesus. One of the first things you notice while standing on the shore is that the sea is, for the most part, surrounded by hills. These rolling hills that wrap around the lake provide a unique characteristic. No matter where you are on the lakeshore, if you turn away from the lake, you can find a hill to walk up. After a short journey, you reach the top of that hill and see a very beautiful panoramic view of the lake. This is very often reflected in the Gospels as one scene flows into the next. In a habitual pattern, Jesus spends a day near the lake, and then in the evening, he turns away from the sea and goes up to the top of a nearby hill to pray or to teach.

What this "going up" symbolically represents is always approaching closer to the heavens and hence closer to God. Jesus leads us up these mountains to teach us. His greatest teaching is the Sermon on the Mount. In the sermon, Jesus talks about those who are "blessed". To our ears today, this sounds poetic and consoling. But when Jesus mentions the "blessed ones" of the Beatitudes, he really would have caught the attention of his audience. These people thought they knew exactly who the "Blessed Ones" were. But they were wrong.

In the time of Jesus, "the Blessed Ones" were, for the Greeks and Romans, the gods on Mt Olympus. They called the gods "blessed" or "happy", which in Greek would be the same root word for the blessings of the beatitudes (Makarios). Because of this, we know that Jesus was really mixing things up! When Jesus claims that those who are poor, hungry, and weeping are the truly blessed ones, he is turning on its head the silly theology of the Greeks and Romans. Now, because of Jesus, divinity on earth was to be found in the poor, humble, and outcast.

For example, the Christ child lying in a poor manger, or the crucified Christ on a cross. To be godlike, for a Christian, does not mean to have Zeus-like powers. It means something else entirely, and this is not an easy concept for us to accept. Our minds grapple with making sense of this. How can a person who is crying and hurting be blessed? How can those experiencing persecution be blessed? In light of heaven, it all makes sense. Until then, we have to accept in faith that what Jesus says is true.

When Jesus gave this sermon, he was standing on a site in the Holy Land that looks out over the Sea of Galilee. He had a multitude of people around him. In the crowd were truly men and women who were mourning, hungering for righteousness, meek and persecuted. Jesus spoke to their suffering hearts. The Beatitudes are a Christ-like, and therefore God-like, way of living. Being faithful to God is not easy. Being a disciple of Jesus is not easy. Our Lord never promised to make things in our lives on earth easy. He never promised us that we would have "happy little lives on earth". Rather, Jesus opened up the gates of heaven. He promised that if we carry our cross, we will arrive in paradise, where every tear will be wiped away!



Legend has it that Blaise was an excellent physician in his hometown of Sebaste, Armenia, modern-day Silvas, Turkey. As a youth, he studied many of the great philosophers. When the Bishop of Sebaste died, Blaise was chosen as the new bishop by the popular acclaim "of all the people." He was said to be a man of great faith and virtue, caring for his people in both body and soul. Many came to him for physical healing as a physician but also received many miracles. Many others came to him for spiritual healing, which was imparted by his deep faith. According to that same legend, even animals would listen to him and obey his commands, and he would heal them of ailments.

In the year 313, the co-ruling Roman Emperors, Constantine I and Licinius, jointly issued the Edict of Milan which established religious toleration throughout the Roman Empire. However, the Acts of Saint Blaise states that in 316, the Governor of Cappadocia, acting on an order by Licinius, began to arrest and kill Christians. Bishop Blaise is reported to have been among those arrested.

While on Blaise's way to jail, the legend continues that a boy was choking on a fishbone, and the boy's mother sent her son to Blaise for his prayers. Bishop Blaise miraculously cured him on the spot. Another story relates that on that journey to jail, a woman begged him to save her pig who had been seized by a wolf. Bishop Blaise ordered the wolf to release the pig and the wolf obeyed. Out of gratitude, the woman brought Blaise two wax candles to give light to his prison cell.

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time Boast in the Lord

What are you most proud of? What do you like to boast about? Were you top of your class in college? Do you work harder than anyone in your office? Everyone likes to have something they are the best at, or at least very good. But it really is kind of silly to base your own worth on what you accomplish. What truly makes us important is that we are loved by God. Our second reading tells how God uses the foolish, weak, or poorest people to shame those who are wise, strong, and wealthy. Why? Because God loves the poor, the weak, the disabled, the homeless just as much as God loves the important people.

And it's not just the external qualities that are important. Some wealthy people have great love for the poor. Some of the best teachers only work with disabled children. Our Gospel on the Beatitudes today makes that clear if you listen carefully. Blessed are not just the poor, but the poor in spirit; not only the hungry, but those who hunger for righteousness. That's what Saint Paul means when he says, "Whoever boasts, should boast in the Lord" (1 Corinthians 1:31).

So how do we get to be "important" to God? Instead of asking God to make my projects a success, I can ask what God wants me to do. And for all the good that you do, remember to thank the Lord.




