

Dear Parishioners,

"You are the salt of the Earth". These words of Jesus sound very familiar to our ears. We have heard them so many times. But we don't often stop and think for a moment about a question that is left open. How exactly can salt lose its flavor? Think about it. What exactly does it mean for salt to lose flavor? Our table salt (sodium chloride), according to chemists, is stable and cannot lose its flavor under normal conditions. If kept dry, salt doesn't chemically break down, evaporate, or become "unsalty". So, for example, have you ever had table salt in your home that you had to throw out because it didn't have flavor? Most likely not.

So, what does Jesus mean? As usual with the parables of Jesus, they often have a different and deeper meaning than what they first appear to have. His words about being the salt of the Earth leave us with a warning. We don't want to lose our "saltiness".

In our lives today, how and when would that occur? Some different theories about the meaning of Jesus have been proposed, and one of them is very helpful for us to consider today. The theory is to recognize that the salt on our tables today is not like the salt in the time of Jesus.

Today, salt is purified and cleaned up before it comes to market. But in the Holy Land, during the time of Jesus, it most likely came from the Dead Sea or evaporation ponds on the coast. To gather salt in this way meant that the salt contained impurities: dirt, gypsum, or other minerals. Thus, there was a lot of "filler" in the salt. When the impure salt was exposed to moisture from the open air, or from a porous clay pot, the *humidity* would dissolve the salt and leave behind the impurities. The result was a powdery and flavorless residue. It looked like salt but had no salty taste. And so, salt that contains additives and impurities, which was frequently the case in the time of Jesus, could lose its flavor. And those, a meaning for us today can be drawn out.

We must avoid impurities in our lives, as these can slowly cause our "salt", or in other words, our soul, to lose its flavor. Our hearts and minds should have the pure love of God within them. Extra things, like sin, addictions, and worldly distractions, can taint our heart and soul, diluting our spirit to the point that we become "worthless".





SAINT SCHOLASTICA (c. 480-543) February 10

What we know about Saint Scholastica is credited to the writings of her twin brother Benedict, who was a great reformer of monastic life and founder of the convent of Monte Cassino. Following the example of her brother, Scholastica founded a second monastery for women in Plombariola. Since entry to people of the opposite sex was prohibited in both communities, Benedict and Scholastica met once a year at an intermediate point to pray and talk about spiritual life. According to sources, when it was time to say goodbye during their last meeting, Scholastica insisted that Benedict stay rather than returning to the convent, but he refused. Then, Scholastica implored God for her brother to remain and the response was a copious storm, such that leaving was unthinkable. Benedict recognized in this action not only the will of God, but also the request that his sister had made to the same God they loved so much. Three days later, Scholastica was called to the eternal homeland. Scholastica valued small things and trust in God.

Fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time A Low-Salt Faith

Jesus uses two different examples of a good disciple—salt of the earth and light of the world. While these images seem to have little in common, there are similarities, the most obvious being that a little of either goes a long way. So also, a little faith can make a big difference. The faith of little children can bring his parents back to the Church. The way we live our faith can speak even louder.

Isaiah gives us some hints in the first reading when he writes about feeding the hungry and giving shelter to the homeless and clothes to the poor. But we sometimes get things backwards. If we do the things Isaiah tells the people to do, we might think that the deeds will give us faith. If we truly believe that God lives in the people around us, especially the poor, then we will want to show our love by caring for each other.

But if we don't have faith, then we are like the salt that has lost its flavor. A low-salt diet may be good for us; but a low-salt faith, instead of making things better, would make them worse. Without faith in God's love for us, we would not respond with love of our own. We could still be a good person, but we would not be a very good disciple. Tom Schmidt


