Dear parishioners,

In today's Sunday liturgy, we have the grace to be able to celebrate the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross. This feast has been on-going in different forms since the year 326. It was then that the Christians in Jerusalem found relics of the true cross of Jesus. They found the cross, and they rejoiced! What can the origin of this feast mean for us today?

For a long time, the first Christians experienced persecutions for following Jesus. They were imprisoned, martyred, and tortured for their faith. But eventually, the persecutions waned as the Christian faith grew and spread across the Roman Empire.

An important historical year to remember is 313 AD, when the Edict of Milan made it permissible to publicly worship as a Christian. This decree made it possible for all people to worship whatever deity they pleased. Shortly after this decree, a history-altering journey was undertaken by the mother of Constantine the Great, St. Helena. She traveled to the Holy Land and desired to use her influence to establish churches and shrines at the holy sites. Until then, there was little established in the way of shrines and churches at the places where Jesus had lived, walked, preached, performed miracles, and especially where he suffered his Passion, Death, and Resurrection. And so, in 326, St. Helena began establishing and recording the locations of the holy sites. Among other things, she helped with excavations of the tomb of Jesus.

Shortly after they began their work, they unearthed the cross of Jesus! They had searched for and found the wood of the cross upon which Jesus had saved the world! This relic caused great rejoicing and was a source of miraculous healing. They began to build a church over the site, and less than a decade later, they dedicated a church with a huge celebration on the 13th and 14th of September, 335 AD.

What these early Christians celebrated many centuries ago is something we should spiritually celebrate today. We can be united with our brothers and sisters from the past when we allow the celebration of the Exaltation of the Cross to transform our own lives. How can we do this? First, just as the first Christians embraced the cross of Jesus and accepted suffering, persecution, and martyrdom, we too should happily embrace any cross that comes from being a Christian in the world today. This may mean living counter-culturally, it may mean avoiding sinful activities, conversations, and forms of entertainment. It can mean all the difficulties that come from living an upright moral life in the public square. Today, an invitation is made to each one of us to find our cross.

What does it mean to find our cross?

This means not to run from suffering as people without faith are apt to do. This means to willingly look for ways to love God and our neighbor, even at personal cost. This means to help others carry their crosses. It means to live a life that gives back more than it takes, to live striving to "do something beautiful for God" as Mother Teresa was accustomed to saying.

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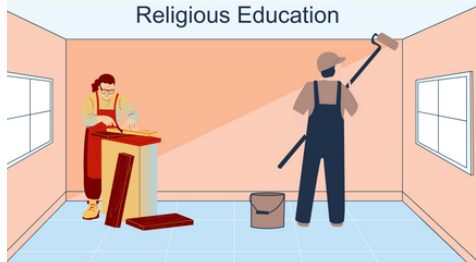

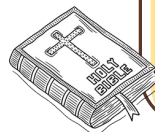

SAINTS CORNELIUS (died 253) AND CYPRIAN (died 258) September 16

Cornelius was a Roman citizen, who, after 14 months without a bishop, succeeded Saint Fabian in the papacy. This new candidate created serious problems for Fabian, as he described the papal election of Cornelius as illegitimate. He was opposed to apostates, those who have abandoned their Christian faith, being received into the Church, while the new Pope Cornelius maintained that they could be readmitted after penance. In 253, persecution was declared against Christians and Cornelius was exiled, suffering captivity and later beheading. During his exile he received a letter from Bishop Cyprian, who congratulated him for suffering in the name of Christ. Cyprian had converted to Christianity at the age of 45, renouncing his pleasant life and embracing not only the Gospel, but also Christian authors, most notably Tertullian. Thanks to his knowledge of oratory and rhetoric, he greatly promoted Christianity in Africa. As a bishop, he was firm and charitable, yet faced persecution and was also later beheaded. Both Cyprian and Cornelius are remembered in Eucharistic Prayer I of the Roman Rite.

Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross Bearing Our Crosses With Joy

We may have any number of crosses throughout our lives. Some may be small, some may be big. Some may be heavy, some may be light. Some may be temporary, some may be long lasting. As Christians, we are called to bear those burdens, not begrudgingly but joyfully. Sometimes that seems downright impossible. How can I have joy in my life when every moment is filled with pain (whether that be physical or emotional)?

The answer is, it is not possible without a profound relationship with our Lord, that includes constant surrender to His will. In His great love for us, He often allows things to happen that we don't understand, but are for our good or for the good of others. After all, the goal for each of us is eternal salvation, not earthly comfort.

But whether we suffer rejection, loneliness, illness, pain, hunger, cold, or even torture and death, we know that He has experienced it all and knows exactly how it feels. We can ask Him to walk with us each step of the way and be our strength when our own fails.

We may get to the point where we are able to rejoice in our sufferings like St. Paul, or endure them without complaint or remember to offer them up. But above all, may our crosses be a constant reminder to us of today's powerful Gospel passage: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him might not perish but might have eternal life" (John 3:16).
