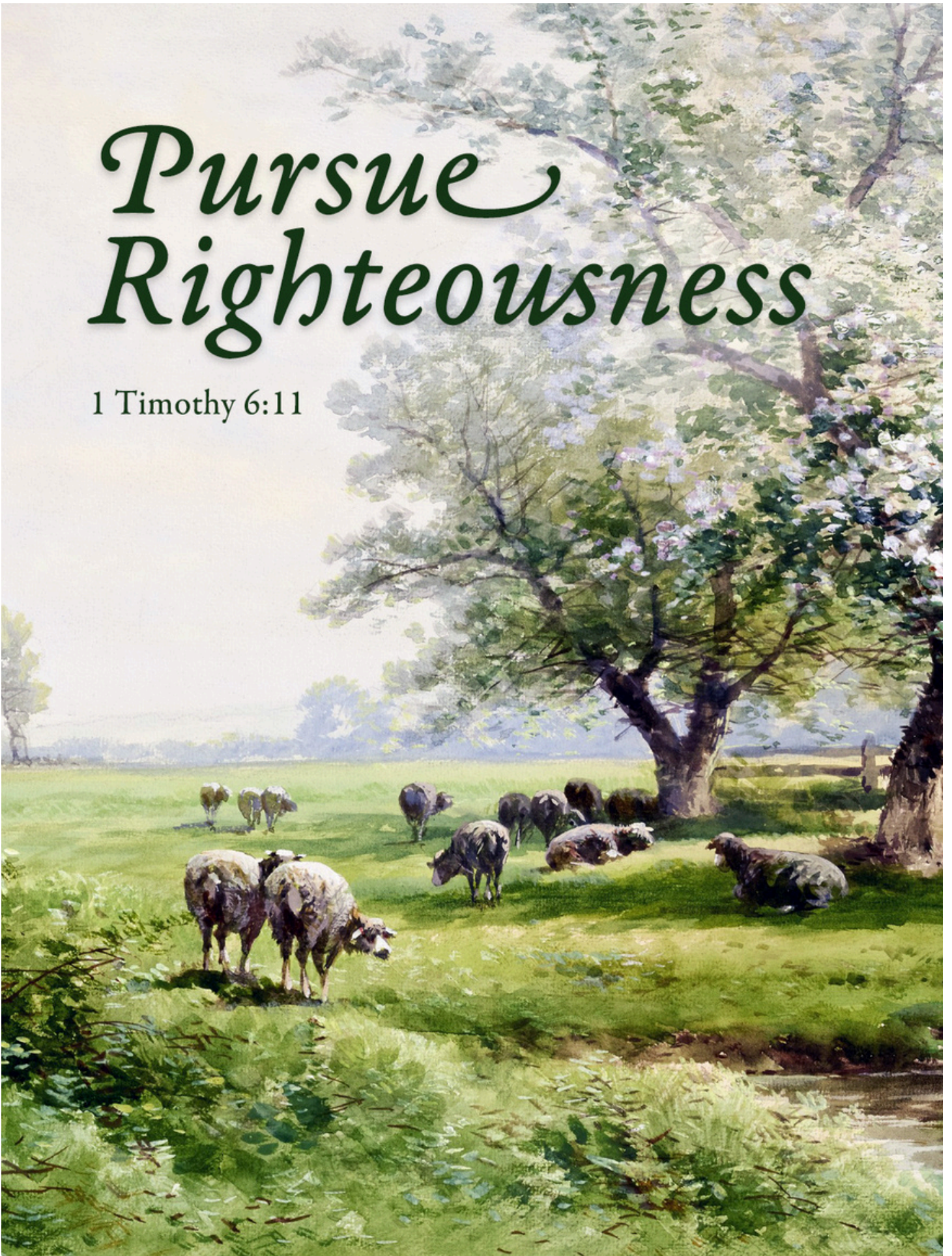

Pursue Righteousness

1 Timothy 6:11

Dear parishioners,

The Gospel for this weekend tells us the parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus. It is a stark reminder that our choices have eternal consequences.

It begins as a story of two very different lives, lived out side by side: a wealthy man named Dives who lived in a palace of luxury and a poor man named Lazarus who lived at the gate to the palace. The heart of this parable lies in its closing words, when Abraham tells the rich man, now suffering in Hades, that even if someone rises from the dead, those who refuse to listen to Moses and the prophets will not be convinced.

We can pause just for a moment and recognize that Jesus himself is the one speaking, and Jesus knows that, despite his suffering and death out of love for us, the miracle of his Resurrection will still not convince many people. This had to have weighed heavily on the heart of Jesus! And we need to be very careful not to assume that since we are here in the pews, we are not the people to whom Jesus is speaking. This is dangerous for our souls. His words should pierce our hearts because they reveal a truth about our weak and fickle human nature: even when we know, deep down, that God's Word is true, that Christ is Lord and Savior, we often resist believing.

As Catholics, we believe the Resurrection itself is the ultimate miracle, and we profess it every Sunday in the Creed. But perhaps we dismiss it often in more subtle ways. Here are three of those ways: First we **Worship Other Gods for Convenience**. We're drawn to other "gods" because they're easier to follow. Second, **We Fear the Cost of Conversion**. We're afraid that following Christ fully will cramp our style. We thus settle for a "middle ground". We think we can be just good enough to get to heaven, but not so holy that we miss out on all the "fun". Third, **We're Swayed by the World's Narrative**. The rich man's brothers were surrounded by a culture that valued wealth and status, blinding them to the poor at their gates.

Today, secular culture bombards us with messages that faith is outdated or irrational, that spiritual realities won't make us happy. We hear voices saying, "You don't need religion to be good." Deep down, we know Christ's truth transcends these objections, but it's easier to go along with the crowd than to hold firm to the Faith. The parable of the Rich Man and Lazarus isn't just a story about wealth and poverty. We can't just easily dismiss it. It's a mirror for our souls. Am I just another Dives, another "rich man" in history? Jesus warns us: our choices have eternal consequences. What "gods" are we serving, and are they worth the cost?

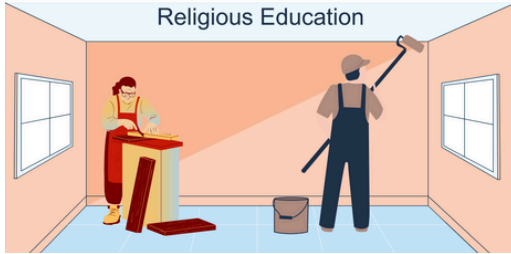

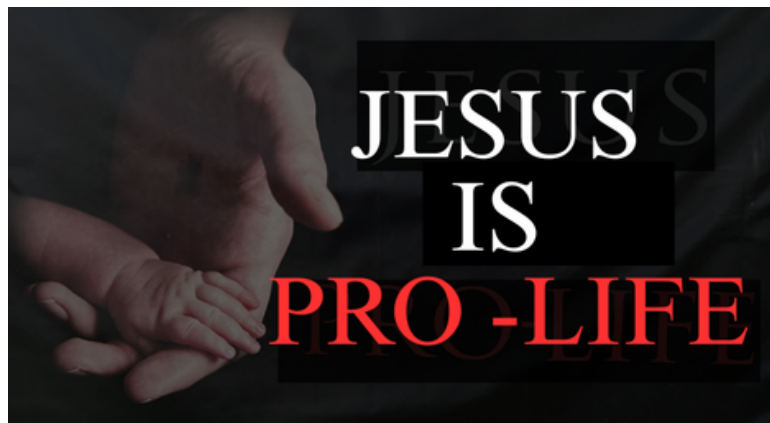

Saint Francis of Assisi (1182-1226) October 4

When Franco Zeffirelli's *Brother Sun, Sister Moon* was released (1972), people were shocked by the movie's graphic nudity in the dramatic conversion scene. Son of a wealthy merchant, Francis' aimless adolescence ended when a failed military expedition led to his imprisonment and complete breakdown. Once home, Francis rediscovered God in the beauty of nature and the ugliness of human suffering, caring for lepers, praying in the little church of San Damiano, whose crucified Jesus he heard calling, "Repair my house, Francis, which is falling into ruins." Francis sold his possessions—and his father's—to fulfill this command. When his father objected, Francis disrobed: "I return the clothes, your name, and all you gave me: God alone is my Father now." Later, the pope would dream of a ragged friar stretching forth a single hand to prop up the crumbling papal Cathedral of Saint John Lateran. Francis indeed helped rebuild the universal Church, founding the Friars Minor (Franciscans), dying at a young forty-four, bearing the stigmata of the Christ whose living icon he remains—in the Church and far beyond it.

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Coach Paul

Today's reading from First Timothy sounds almost like a coach getting his team ready for the big game. This coach has much higher goals than a home run or a touchdown. Instead of pursuing a league championship, he seeks faith, love, patience, and gentleness. How about us? Are we in the game or on the sidelines? Let's look at what Coach Paul is talking about.

Faith is a relationship with the Lord in which we imitate Jesus' outlook on life, his teachings, his love of God. We struggle with his commands to love our enemies, to turn the other cheek, to forgive all wrongs, and to take up our cross each day. As Paul would say, we are "competing well for the faith."

We pursue love by listening to the Gospel, in which Jesus tells the parable of the rich man who was only concerned with his own comfort. Jesus says that if we truly understood the prophets, such as our first reading from Amos, we would not spend all our energy and wealth on ourselves.

As we learn to let go of our need to have everything go our way, we become more patient with people who disagree with us, or with frustrations and problems. We learn to see God in our setbacks as well as in our successes. Experiencing the Lord is the championship we want.
